Summary

This sermon focuses on Stephen from Acts 6-8, using his life as an example of what it means to walk with God. Taylor emphasizes that when we walk with God, we begin to look like Him, act like Him, and move like Him. Stephen's story demonstrates how a life in step with the Spirit results in God flowing through us, even in the face of persecution and death. The message challenges believers to examine who they are walking with spiritually, as we become like those we surround ourselves with. Through Stephen's example of grace under pressure, forgiveness toward his persecutors, and unwavering focus on Jesus even unto death, we see a model of authentic Christian living that impacts others and advances God's kingdom.

Questions

- 1. What stands out to you most about Stephen's character and how he handled persecution?
- 2. Taylor said 'who you walk with is who you become.' How have you seen this principle play out in your own life, both positively and negatively?
- 3. Stephen's face glowed like an angel when he was before the council. What are some ways people today might 'look like God' when they walk closely with Him?
- 4. Even while being stoned to death, Stephen prayed for his persecutors' forgiveness, echoing Jesus' words on the cross. How can we develop this kind of Christ-like response to those who hurt us?

- 5. Stephen saw Jesus standing at the right hand of God even in his darkest moment. How can we maintain our focus on Jesus during difficult circumstances in our lives?
- 6. The sermon mentioned that Stephen moved with purpose, seeing people as 'precious' rather than 'projects.' How can we shift our perspective to see others the way God sees them?
- 7. What are some practical ways we can 'walk in step with the Spirit' in our daily routines and relationships?
- 8. Taylor's grandfather continued to talk about Jesus even while battling dementia. What does it look like to make Jesus the priority in our lives regardless of our circumstances?

Life Application

This week, identify one relationship or situation where you can intentionally 'walk with God' by responding more like Jesus. Whether it's showing forgiveness to someone who has hurt you, speaking truth in love to a difficult person, or simply being a light in a dark situation, commit to letting God flow through you in that specific area. Ask God daily to help you look like Him, act like Him, and move like Him in this situation.
