Reflection for the Season of Advent

The O Antiphons

What is an antiphon? The word comes from the Greek or Latin, meaning "responsive sound." An antiphon is typically a verse or song sung recited or sung before and after a psalm. Its primary purpose is to introduce and interpret a liturgical text, such as a psalm or scripture reading.

The O Antiphons are attested in monastic communities from the 7th to the 8th centuries, likely first used as sung refrains before the Magnificat at evening prayer (Vespers) in Rome. Each antiphon draws from Old Testament titles for the hoped-for Messiah, weaving together Israel's longing with the Church's Advent expectation of Christ's coming.

In Latin, the first letters of their seven images of Christ—Sapientia (Wisdom), Adonai (Lord), Radix Jesse (Root of Jesse), Clavis David (Key of David), Oriens (Radiant Dawn), Rex Gentium (Ruler of the nations), and Emmanuel (God with us)—make up a backward acrostic, spelling ero cras: "tomorrow I will [come]."

To help us prepare for the arrival of Christ, we have prepared a daily video reflection (print copies available) based on the O Antiphons. They will be posted on our App and Facebook Page starting December 17.

Coupons for Missions? What does it mean?

You may notice the line item in the church budget for Coupons for Missions. What is that? What does it mean? It simply refers to the proceeds we receive from the Kroger Rewards Program. Since the creation of the Kroger Rewards system in 2003, church members connected their Kroger Reward card to benefit Maxwell Street and its hunger ministries. I can remember mission committee members (Jody Lambert, Susan Hensley, Jim Ogle) pushing Kroger cards in worship. One year Jim had a large poster size Kroger rewards card to demonstrate the importance of the program.

Historically, Maxwell Street has received between \$1500-2000 annually from this program. For various reasons, the proceeds year-to-date is at the lowest rate yet, \$816. We have been fortunate to have new friends and members join our worshiping community. So, for those who may be unaware of the program, here is an easy way to give to the hunger ministries at MSPC.

And the best part is - it doesn't cost anything extra. Whatever money you spend on your groceries at Kroger, a portion comes back to Maxwell Street for the hunger ministries. So, if you're not already connected with a Kroger Plus card, take the time to log onto your Kroger account (like when you're clipping coupons for the week), and make sure Maxwell Street Presbyterian is the beneficiary organization for the rewards program.



Sign up for Kroger Rewards

Here's how: Log into your account. Look under "my account," scroll down to the "community rewards," section, either enroll or change your organization. Maxwell Street's number is VK950.



Maxwell Street Presbyterian Church and Zoe Empowers have been in partnership for many years, but many of you may not know about that.

What is Zoe Empowers? An international organization working with orphaned children living in extreme poverty.

How and where does Zoe Empowers do its' work? Since 2007, Zoe Empowers has translated the empowerment model in 11 countries: Kenya, Rwanda, Zimbabwe, Malawi, Liberia, Tanzania, Mozambique, India, South Sudan, Uganda, and Zambia. Each program within the Zoe network is locally owned and operated. Through a three-year, locally-led program, vulnerable youth are organized into groups of 60-100 and receive micro grants, life skills, and vocational training to become secure, healthy, and connected community members. MSPC helps to sponsor one of these groups.





What have been the results of its' work? By the end of 2024, Zoe had transformed the lives of 219,764 children. Every dollar invested generated more than ten times its value in income for participants. In Kenya alone, this work represents a

21-fold increase in personal well-being. The most significant changes were observed in participants' emotional and physical health, sense of purpose, strength of relationships, and overall life satisfaction. Scan the QR code to learn more about Zoe Empowers.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

After struggling to find parking due to the first game of the UK Women's Basketball season, the Session convened for their regularly scheduled November Session meeting on November 3rd at 7:00pm. Wes Bullock opened the meeting with a reflection on Zacchaeus, drawing parallels between Jesus' approach to Zacchaeus and his own experience recruiting students from Asbury University for an environmental program. He emphasized the importance of seeing potential in others and treating them with love and respect, even when they may not initially share the same values or beliefs. Wes also highlighted the need for open dialogue and understanding across different perspectives, especially in today's polarized society. Matt opened the business portion of the meeting with prayer.

Since it is Stewardship Season, Matt led a session on stewardship, sharing an article from Duke Divinity School that highlighted three faith communities' practices. The Session discussed how the church uses its space for community programs like Al-Anon, AA, and a clothing closet, emphasizing the importance of fellowship and connection. Matt also mentioned the need for financial education.

The Session then discussed several community concerns and approved the membership record. They also

approved the transfer of Joshua and Felicia Jennings to First Presbyterian Church in Durham, North Carolina. Matt reported on the financial status, noting slightly increased gifts and pledges for the previous month, with the year-to-date balance remaining positive. The Budget and Stewardship Committee's stewardship campaign will conclude November 9th with Pledge Sunday, and members were reminded to submit their 2026 budget numbers to Kate or Matt.

The session discussed several key topics, including the nominating committee's progress in filling vacancies, with two elders and three deacons still needed. They approved endowment fund distributions totaling \$42,000 across three accounts, with specific allocations for music programs, facilities repairs, and various outreach initiatives. Those awards will be announced at the November Annual Meeting. The group scheduled the 2026 session retreat for January 10th, with the 24th as a backup date, and discussed plans to create a new committee for the second phase of the capital campaign focused on renovations. They also agreed to collect committee needs assessments by December 15th and review policy updates before the January meeting.

The meeting adjourned with prayer at 8:00 pm. The next meeting will be Monday, December 1st at 7:00 pm.
