More than 30 volunteers helped create a joyful Christmas Shoppe experience for 23 E7 children as they carefully used their vouchers to choose meaningful gifts for their families. Each child also selected books, a coloring book, and crayons for themselves, and enjoyed cookies and hot chocolate along the way. The smiles on their faces were a reminder of how deeply valued they are.

Transported by their teachers, these students were able to shop for their family members thanks to your generous donations. It was a gift to extend the joy of the Christmas Shoppe to even more families in our community.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

Our December Session meeting was held on the 8th at 7:00pm. Laura Zolman opened our meeting with a reflection on Anne Lamott's writing, discussing themes of suffering, hope, and resilience. She invited us to reflect on how we could better care for ourselves and each other while continuing to support those in need. Prayer concerns were shared, including updates on congregation members' health. The Clerk's reports were approved, and the meeting moved on to committee reports.

With Matt's help, the Budget and Stewardship Committee presented the financial report for 2025, noting the congregation is in good shape financially but facing high utility expenses. Matt reviewed the proposed 2026 budget, highlighting adjustments such as increased interest income, decreased work camp fees, and a proposed deficit of \$21,500. Matt recommended setting aside \$21,500 from the operating fund to cover the deficit, and the Budget and Stewardship Committee endorsed this suggestion. After some discussion, the motion to approve the budget was approved by the Session.

The group also discussed an audit recommendation for 2025, with Elizabeth suggesting a new firm for a review at a lower cost than the current provider.

The worship committee proposed the communion schedule for 2026, including the first Sunday of each month, Maundy Thursday, Christmas Eve, and the first week of Advent. The personnel committee discussed Marianne's resignation from the communications position, effective at the end of the year, and proposed expanding the role to include church growth and community outreach. Matt outlined plans for the new communications director to focus on welcoming new members, integrating into church life, and maintaining existing communication responsibilities. Jay provided updates on maintenance projects, including organ wall repairs, elevator upgrades, and parking lot lighting. The campus ministry reported strong growth with 12 weekly attendees, and plans were discussed for student outreach and potential retreats.

Those elders who were completing their service on Session were recognized and thanked for their dedication. The Session shared updates on personal and congregational joys and concerns, including health challenges and upcoming events. The meeting ended with a prayer for the congregation and the wider world around 8:00pm.

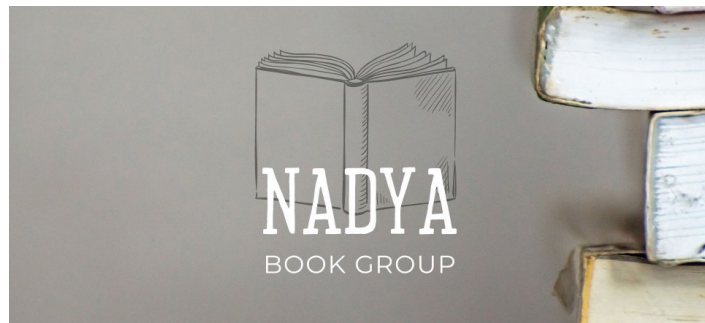
Sunday, January 18
