Christ the King Sunday Gospel Reading: Luke 23:33-43

#### The Point

Jesus is the one true king, but he is not the one everyone expected.

### **Key Verse**

There was also an inscription over him, "This is the King of the Jews." Luke 23:38

#### **Scripture Summaries**

**Gospel:** Luke 23:33-43 The Crucified King

Even when Jesus is being crucified, Jesus prays for forgiveness for his persecutors. He is mocked as King of the Jews, but those mocking him do not realize that Jesus is king not only of the Jews but the king of kings. One of the criminals crucified with him derides Jesus, while the other rebukes the derider. The second asks Jesus for mercy, believing that he is the king and that this is not the end of Jesus' kingdom. Jesus promises that this repentant criminal will be with Jesus in paradise.

#### First Reading: Jeremiah 23:1-6

God condemns the leaders of Israel with an analogy of shepherds who destroy and scatter, doing the opposite of their jobs. God will raise up better shepherds and the people will not fear nor be lost.

#### **Second Reading:** Colossians 1:11-20

The writer gives a blessing that the people be strong, giving thanks to God who has rescued us and moved us into the kingdom of God's beloved Son. God's Son is no usual king, but the one through whom we have forgiveness.

## **Seasons & Festivals**

Today is Christ the King Sunday. This is the final Sunday in the liturgical year, meaning that a new year begins next Sunday with the beginning of Advent. Christ the King Sunday celebrates the kingship of Jesus, and how this kingship in turn influences our response to him. In Luke's Gospel, Jesus takes the expectations of even this kingship and turns them upside down.

#### **Discussion Starters**

- If you were royalty, what would you do for your people?
- How is Jesus different from most kings?
- Take turns being royalty for a day. Give the royal one a symbol to carry for the day. After a week, talk about how the different royalty acted.

Jesus, you are our one true king. Thank you for being a loving example of a servant king. Amen.

Humility means thinking of others before yourself. This week, be intentional about serving your family members.

# **Friday**

#### **Read Hebrews 11:1-7** Faith is confidence in what we hope for.

Which of these heroes of the faith are you like? Why?

# **Saturday**

#### Read Genesis 6:11-22 Noah builds the ark.

Float a toy boat in a large bowl as you listen to this story.
