A WORD FROM PASTOR FAZIO . . .

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Can you believe that the season of Advent is upon us already? As I get older, life seems to be moving faster and faster, especially with two teenage sons growing into men...when did this happen??? Now, with Christmas right around the corner, the world of sales and marketing is telling us that we need to become even busier than we already are so we don't miss out on the latest and greatest toy, game or sporting good item. It's all too easy to get caught up in the hype of the season and lose sight of why we're celebrating to begin with.

One way that we can slow ourselves down in the midst of the ensuing chaos is to simply focus on being present in the moment and pay attention to our surroundings. I've been noticing various changes going on in the stores around town; they're looking greener with the presence of Christmas trees and even smelling more like the holiday season with the scents of cinnamon and hot apple cider. Soon, our church too will take on a different appearance with the Advent season.

For me, seeing the Advent wreath, and all that it symbolizes to us as Christians, is an excellent reminder to slow down and pay attention. The Advent wreath, like most symbols, has an interesting history. It first developed in the pre-Christian practices of northern Europe. People of that region sought the return of the sun during the darkest time of the year (at the winter solstice) by lighting candles and fires. Then, as early as the Middle Ages, Christians adopted the use of candles and began using fire and light to represent Christ's coming into the world. Using this same symbolism, the Advent wreath developed a few centuries ago in Germany as a sign of the waiting and hopeful expectation of the glorious return of our Lord.

The wreath, a circle, came to represent the eternal victory over death through Christ, and the unending reign of God. The evergreens became a sign of the faithfulness of God to His people, even unto death, and the lighted candles were a reminder of the light of Christ that has come into the world. The wreath is outfitted with five candles; one being lit each week as a way of preparing for the coming of the Messiah. Week after week we will light one more candle as our anticipation of the mystery and wonder of Christmas grows. The four candles represent our hope, peace, love, and joy that are present in Christ, and at the center of the wreath stands the candle representing Jesus himself, which will be lit on Christmas Eve in commemoration of his miraculous birth in Bethlehem.

As we go about our daily lives this Advent season, we will surely from time to time get caught up in life's busyness. That's why we need to be encouraged all the more to take the time as often as possible to be still, realize the true nature of Advent and Christmas, and notice His wonderful presence in our midst. Life does move quickly; let's not fail to notice the miracle as we're planning our next events.

SOCIAL MINISTRY

November 30th and December 7th coffee hours will benefit the **Capuchin Community Services food pantry**.

Unity Lutheran Church is a warming center every night (7pm – 7am) through March to provide shelter for adults. Seasonal clothing and food donations are in need.

Clothing ministry: *(emphasis on:* hooded sweatshirts, men's gloves, new men's gym socks, backpacks) men's belts, men's jeans (waist size 34 inches and lower), quilts, blankets, new underwear, shoes, shirts, sweaters, coats, boots, hygiene items (deodorant, foot powder, lotion, body wipes, toothpaste, toothbrushes).
