The Church of the Nazarene is a Protestant Christian church in the Wesleyan-Holiness tradition. Organized in 1908, the denomination is now home to about 2.6 million members worshipping in more than 30,000 local congregations in 164 world areas.

MISSIONARY HEALTHCARE

The cost of providing insurance for Nazarene Missionaries is quite high. In fact, the cost for health insurance alone for a year is approximately \$1.9 million, and the costs continue to rise. Yet, the Church of the Nazarene wants its Missionaries to be able to serve and not worry about where they will scrape up the cost of the next premium.

Nazarene Missions International has helped subsidize some of these funds since as early as 1919. Through your giving to the Memorial Roll, Distinguished Service Award, Gifts from the Heart, and Missionary Health Care plate offerings, you helped offset approximately 23 percent of those insurance costs. In 2024 Missionary Health Care was able to provide \$336,276 in medical assistance for Nazarene missionaries. Also, 364 retired missionaries were able to receive benefits through the Global Missions Pension Plan in 2024 Thank you!

JESUS FILM HARVEST PARTNERS

Based on the Gospel of Luke, the JESUS Film was sponsored and financed by Campus Crusade for Christ. It is the most accurate depiction of the life of Christ ever produced. After five years of painstaking research, JESUS was filmed in 1978 at over 200 locations in the Holy Land. The cast included more than 5,000 people and nearly every word spoken by Christ is taken directly from scripture.

- JESUS Film Evangelism—JESUS Film teams work in target areas identified by church leaders to assist with church growth and to start new churches.
- Discipleship—Each film team works with local leaders to disciple new believers.
- Leadership Development—Current leaders receive leadership training, learn how to train other leaders, and learn how to disciple new believers.
- Pastor Training—Current pastors receive ongoing training, new pastors begin the course of study, and lay pastors are trained to shepherd new believers.
- Church Planting—Team members and church leaders assist the new believers in joining existing churches or becoming part of a new church.
- Prayer—Prayer is the fuel that drives this ministry forward. It is critical and vital to sustain the work.
- Partnerships—Partnering organizations add vision, tools, training, expertise, prayer support, and financial resources resulting in success for the kingdom.

The cost of the DSA is \$125. Duplicates of the award are \$25 each. The certificate fits into a standard 8"x10" frame.

The Memorial Roll, established in 1919, is a way to honor deceased friends and loved ones. A certificate is issued in the name of the person memorialized and is often presented to a family member or displayed in the church. Churches or individuals may place as many names on the Memorial Roll as they

desire, and those memorialized need not be members of the church. We recognize those who have passed to their eternal reward with a certificate each May.

The cost of placing someone on the Memorial Roll is \$75. You will receive a certificate that fits into a standard 8"x10" frame. Duplicates of the certificate are \$25 each.

MISSIONS PRIORITY ONE


Mission Priority One recognition goes to churches which have embraced the Five Areas of Impact of NMI: Prayed for the lost and for global missionaries, gave to World

Evangelism Fund (payment of 5.5% or higher), Alabaster offering remitted, Engaged Children and Youth, and Links support (by prayer and/or financially).

Global NMI realizes that not all churches have children and youth, so on the annual Local NMI President's report, it states that a church can answer yes to this question if they had no children or youth, but would have engaged them in missions if they did.

CHURCH OF EXCELLENCE AWARD

If a church's giving surpasses 5.7% and higher, that church qualifies for a Church of Excellence award.

Please be sure to follow the instruction sheet *exactly* for what goes into the Crisis Care Kits Because of customs regulations, it is essential that we know the precise contents of each Kit so as not to deter a shipment.

INSTRUCTIONS: Put the following items Into a 2 or 2.5 GALLON ZIP-LOC BAG:

- 1 medium size bottle of shampoo (12 to 18oz.), please tape flip-tops closed
- 2 bars of soap (bath-size or larger)
- 1 medium toothpaste (4.0 to 6.4 oz.)
- 3 toothbrushes
- 1 box of Band-Aids (30 or more)
- 4 pocket-size packages of facial tissue
- 1 Beanie Baby-size stuffed toy
- 7 unscented sanitary pads
- 1 fingernail clipper
- 2 hand towels

HISTORY OF NAZARENES MISSIONS INTERNATIONAL

Nazarene Missions International (NMI) traces its origin primarily to the Association of Pentecostal Churches of America (APCA), when in April 1899, the Woman's Missionary Society (WMS) was founded.

The WMS was officially recognized as an auxiliary organization of the Church of the Nazarene in 1915 at the fourth General Assembly. It was recommended that there be an organization in each local church to increase knowledge and interest in missions by prayer, by obtaining special speakers, and by keeping in touch with the missionaries; and to cooperate with the (local) Church Board in raising their apportionments (for missions).

The name of the ministry has changed over the course of its history:

- 1928 Woman's Foreign Missionary Society (WFMS),
- 1952 Nazarene Foreign Missionary Society (reflecting the introduction of men, youth, and children into the organization),
- 1964 Nazarene World Missionary Society,
- 1980 Nazarene World Mission Society (reflecting the international aspect of the organization),

NAZARENE MISSIONARIES

There are two types of Nazarene Missionaries:

- The **SPONSORED MISSIONARY** is primarily funded by his or her local community and called to serve a localized need in the field.  - The **GLOBAL MISISONARY** is funded by the global efforts of World Evangelism and called to serve a full career in the field. Affirmed by the Church of the Nazarene, they have prior ministry experience, and will strategically serve a global assignment wherever they are needed in the world.
- Primarily World Evangelism funded
- Serves from two years to full career
- Prior ministry or specialty service experience
- Assigned by the church where needed

Churches lay the foundation through alabaster offerings for plac-

es where people worship, heal, and learn by encouraging global participation each year. Every alabaster project is a joint effort of local contribution and labor, combined with global love an support in bringing tangible presence and a sense of



long-term commitment to a community. No Alabaster funds are used for administrative costs.

Nazarenes gave US \$ 2.8 million for alabaster to fund projects in 2024. The Alabaster offering is used in all six global regions.

Often, Alabaster giving goes hand in hand with NM Teams. NMI assisted 355 NM teams, comprised of 4,664 participants for projects.

ENGAGING CHLDREN & YOUTH IN MISSIONS



We engage children and youth in learning about and participating in the mission of God. We collaborate with NDI and NYI to ensure that all children and youth have a spirit of missions within them.

NMI provides Kids Kaleidoscope as part of NMI Central to help nurture a spirit of missions in children. Kids kaleidoscope connects

to the focus story in NMI central the first Wednesday of each month.

International Student Scholarship Fund provided 85 scholarships for students outside the USA/ Canada to attend Nazarene theological institutions.

WHAT IS WEF?

The World Evangelism Fund fuels the Church of the Nazarene's mission by combining each person's and church's gift together to fund ministries everywhere. Every church is asked to give a portion of their yearly funds for the purpose of making Christlike disciples in the nations or 5.5% of our annual income received.

We also use Easter Offering and Thanksgiving Offering to raise awareness for the World Evangelism Fund. These two offerings happen every year, and informational resources to help communicate these offerings to our congregation. We also use Global Missions Commitments to raise funds throughout the year. We encourage everyone to actively engage in understanding and giving toward mission work through the World Evangelism Fund. Our goal is to invest more than the required 5.5% goal toward missions, and those gifts make a huge difference.

A church that gives 5.7% or more in the convention year gains **Church of Excellence** status, and we strive to be a **Church of Excellence** in all we do as Harvesters.

We inform our churches of the world's need and how the Church of the Nazarene is responding through the WEF. We encourage every church to faithfully participate in giving to the WEF.

50 educational institutions, including seven graduate seminaries/theological colleges, 14 liberal arts colleges/ universities (13 graduate programs), 18 undergraduate seminaries/theological colleges, 8 certificate and diploma bible colleges, 2 nurses training colleges, one teacher training college, and 1023 education centers (approved extension centers), in 110 world areas had a 2023-2024 combined enrollment of 43,476 students globally.

Persons in need were treated at community-based clinics and health care centers all over the world with concentrated efforts in India, Papua New Guinea, and Eswatini

ENGAGING CHILDREN & YOUTH

Engaging children and youth by helping them learn about and participate in God's mission nurtures them as they seek to respond to God's call. NMI advocates in every church and district to encourage and engage every generation to share in missions. We collaborate with Nazarene Youth International and Nazarene Discipleship International to best engage all ages.

CARE & CONNECTION

NMI provides care and connection to global, sponsored, volunteer, and retired Nazarene missionaries. Care and connection begins when a missionary discerns a call to missions and continues during their service and throughout the adjustment of returning to their home country.

CARE includes the steps where NMI is involved in nurturing, sending, and supporting Nazarene missionaries from Nazarene churches and districts.

CONNECTION consists of ways in which NMI connects with and supports Nazarene missionaries.

Links is part of NMI's Care and Connection, assisting churches and districts in intentional care and connection to globally deployed Nazarene missionaries who are not from their district.

Is it LINKS or Links?

Originally, LINKS was an acronym that only worked in the English language. Nazarenes worship in over 200 languages each week, and we are a global Church. The acronym was dropped, but the spirit of intentionally linking churches and

missionaries remains strong.

Links is a mutual relationship between the sending church and missionaries.

WHAT IS GLOBAL MISSIONS

Global Missions exists to make Christlike disciples in the nations. The purpose of missions is to pioneer, develop, and resource local, interdependent, and sustainable Nazarene churches. Nazarene Missions centers around compassion, evangelism and education. Nazarene missionaries partner with local ministers and lay leaders to bring restoration, share the Gospel, and build sustainability within the community.

Nazarene Missions provides a full range of compassionate ministries that address systemic problems. From natural disaster relief to child development, Nazarene Missions has reach, impact, and longevity through compassionate ministries, hospitals and clinics, disaster response and Work and Witness.

The power of Christ's Gospel through the witness of the Holy Spirit draws people near, prompting transformation of the heart and life. Nazarene Missions prayerfully sends missionaries into new territories where they participate in the movement of the Holy Spirit to bring salvation and restoration.

The purpose of mission education is fully realized when our churches have the knowledge to thrive. Nazarene Missions helps facilitate training, teaching, and resourcing to support our local Nazarene churches around the globe through discipleship training and leadership development.

CARE AND CONNECTION

The traditional Links (Loving Interested Nazarenes Knowing

and Sharing) program has changed its name to "Care and Connection". This change began in 2022 and 2023 will complete the transition. Starting in 2024, new missionary assignments are expected at the beginning of each calendar year.



While the terminology and timing has changed, the goals of loving, caring, and connecting with missionaries is unchanged and represents a key factor in being a Missions Priority One church. That means all of the following are still recommended!

- Write your missionaries and assure them of your prayers, asking for personal requests.
- Send remembrances for special days like birthdays, anniversaries, and holidays. Remember surface mail takes quite a while to arrive in some locations, so plan accordingly.
- Children and youth find it especially meaningful to become personally acquainted with a missionary or a missionary's child. Encourage young people to send cards, small gifts, pictures, videos, and audio materials to your church's missionaries.
- See if your missionaries can use Skype, Facetime, or Zoom and have a church chat.
