LIVE SENT

Day 1

Bible Verse :

Romans 12:1-2; "And so, dear brothers and sisters, I plead with you to give your bodies to God because of all he has done for you. Let them be a living and holy sacrifice—the kind he will find acceptable. This is truly the way to worship him. Don't copy the behavior and customs of this world, but let God transform you into a new person by changing the way you think. Then you will learn to know God's will for you, which is good and pleasing and perfect."

Application :

Two options:

- Tell your parents you made the bed but leave it halfway, and see their reaction. Did they count it as made? Did they think it was a joke?
- Volunteer to set up the table for dinner and leave the silverware off the table. Did everyone act surprised that you missed the silverware? Did they seem to think you didn't finish setting up the table?

Whatever you chose, you said you would do it, but then you did it halfway (because I suggested that), but as we start our prayer and fasting time, I want to encourage you to think about your relationship with God. He wants all of your body (your thoughts, your actions, your words), and he desires full surrender of these things. Not a little bit, or halfway surrender. So, like when you sort of set up the table, or sort of made the bed, and everyone thought you didn't do it: in your relationship with God, he desires full commitment and surrender.

Prayer :

God, like Romans 12:1-2 says, I want to present my body to you as an act of worship, but I need your help. I want to surrender my thoughts, my actions, and my words to you. I want to live sent, live on mission, but I know it starts in my relationship with you. In Jesus' name,
amen.

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Day 1

Activity :

Pray and ask God to show you what a day in your life would look like if you surrendered your body to Him.

Day 2

Bible Verse :

Hebrews 11:6; “And it is impossible to please God without faith. Anyone who wants to come to him must believe that God exists and that he rewards those who sincerely seek him.”

Application :

You will need a box or container that isn't see-through. You will have to pick a random object or picture of an object (you can ask for help from an adult to print the picture of “the thing” you picked, for example: an elephant). You will place the object or a printed photo of it in the box, and then you will go around and ask friends and family if they believe you that there is that thing inside the box. Example: Mom/Dad, would you believe me if I told you that I have an elephant inside the box? It would be hard to believe, but you know it is true! You put it in there, they will have to believe and take your word for it. In the same way, God is true; what He does and who He is is true and trustworthy. He is pleased when you believe in Him and what He does.

Prayer :

God, I want to have faith in who you are and what you do. I want to have a faith that pleases you. In Jesus' name, amen.

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Day 3

Bible Verse :

Hebrews 11:17-18; “It was by faith that Abraham offered Isaac as a sacrifice when God was testing him. Abraham, who had received God’s promises, was ready to sacrifice his only son, Isaac, even though God had told him, Isaac is the son through whom your descendants will be counted. Abraham reasoned that if Isaac died, God was able to bring him back to life again. And in a sense, Abraham did receive his son back from the dead.”

Application :

Grab a chair and sit on it. Stand back up. Now do 5 jumping jacks next to it, and go back to sit on it. Stand back up. Yell at the chair to the top of your lungs, and now sit on it. Stand back up. Grab something heavy, and sit on the chair. Put the thing down. Did the chair hold you every time? Did the chair change shapes? Did the chair change its purpose? Just like the chair's purpose, sturdiness, and trustworthiness didn't change. Abraham knew God's promises don't change, even under crazy circumstances, or even when it seems impossible. God has promised a great nation would come from his son; however, now Abraham was being asked to present his son as a sacrifice!! However, when Abraham displayed trust and willingness to do so, God spared Abraham's son's life because of Abraham's faith in God. Like you had faith in the chair to hold you, God desires you to trust Him even in the craziest circumstances.

Prayer :

God, would you please help me to trust you and believe your promises even when it is hard? In Jesus' name, amen.

Day 3

Activity :

Think about your circumstances in your life right now, and pick one thing: it could be a hard relationship with a sibling, someone is sick in the family, or an upcoming test at school. Look at the list you made yesterday about God's attributes, and pick one that you think would help you in the circumstance you picked. Write it out on a Post-it and stick it next to your bed. Now, every time you feel discouraged, uncertain, or angry, you can go to that Post-it and be reminded about who God is in the middle of hard circumstances.

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Day 4

Bible Verse :

Romans 4:1-6; “Abraham was, humanly speaking, the founder of our Jewish nation. What did he discover about being made right with God? If his good deeds had made him acceptable to God, he would have had something to boast about. But that was not God’s way. For the Scriptures tell us, ‘Abraham believed God, and God counted him as righteous because of his faith.’ When people work, their wages are not a gift, but something they have earned. **But people are counted as righteous, not because of their work, but because of their faith in God who forgives sinners.** David also spoke of this when he described the happiness of those who are declared righteous without working for it:”

Application :

Grab a bag with a hole in it, and try to store uncooked rice in it. What happened? Did the bag help store the rice? Eventually, the rice fell from the bag to the floor because of the hole! (Remember to help with clean up!) In the same way, when we try to earn God’s favor and be good in His eyes by doing the right things like being kind to a sibling, going to church, tithing, and helping our friends, it is useless like trying to store uncooked rice in a bag with a hole. Those things cannot make us good in God’s eyes. The only thing that can make us right with God is faith in His Son Jesus, the one who came to die for our sins, was buried, and rose again, defeating sin and death. If you have faith in Jesus as your personal Savior, then he makes you new, like a bag with no holes (grab one) and pour uncooked rice in it. Did the rice stay in? Yes! God makes us complete.

Prayer :

God, I want to always be reminded that my relationship with you doesn’t depend on the good things I can do for you, but on how good You are by giving your Son to die on the cross for me. In Jesus’ name, amen.

Day 4

Activity :

Share with someone in your family or a friend the time when you trusted Jesus as your Savior and how that makes you good in God's eyes. If you haven't made that decision yet, today is a great day to do that!

Day 5

Bible Verse :

Hebrews 11:39-12:2; “All these people earned a good reputation because of their faith, yet none of them received all that God had promised. For God had something better in mind for us, so that they would not reach perfection without us. Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a huge crowd of witnesses to the life of faith, let us strip off every weight that slows us down, especially the sin that so easily trips us up. And let us run with endurance the race God has set before us. We do this by keeping our eyes on Jesus, the champion who initiates and perfects our faith. Because of the joy awaiting him, he endured the cross, disregarding its shame. Now he is seated in the place of honor beside God’s throne.”

Application :

Race time! You will need to find a chronometer to keep track of your timing in racing. You can have your parents help, or you can count for yourself. You will race from one end of a room in your home to the opposite end. Three rounds: First round, 3, 2, 1, GO! What was your timing? How did you feel running? In the second round, grab a backpack and fill it with heavy books. 3, 2, 1, GO! What was your timing? How did you feel running? Last round, keep the backpack on and add obstacles, it can be chairs, toys, a sibling on the way, etc. Ready? 3, 2, 1, GO! What was your timing? How did you feel running?

Paul compares our Christian lives to a race, like the one you raced today. However, in this race, the backpack that was filled with books and weights that kept you from going faster is compared to things that slow us down from keeping our eyes on Jesus. Also, in the last round, you had obstacles, and those are compared to sin (anything you say, do, or think that goes against God), sin keeps you from running to Jesus with endurance.

Prayer :

I pray you will forgive the sins that are keeping me from running faster towards you, and that you will help me to get rid of distractions that are slowing me down to live in a way that pleases you. In Jesus’ name, amen.

Day 5

Activity :

Write or draw:

Things in your life that make you run slowly towards Jesus:

- *Remember, these things aren't necessarily bad (example: TV, video games, reading books)

Sins in your life that trip you in your race:

Think about whether or not you need to confess your sins to God, and if you need to change something in your schedule to run faster, like in the first round towards Jesus.

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Day 6

Bible Verse:

Esther 2:10; “ Esther had not made known her people or kindred, for Mordecai had commanded her not to make it known.”

Application :

Esther was in a tough spot. In her city, the King was looking for a new wife and she was among the last few women who might possibly be chosen for this role. Esther was Jewish and the King was not. The Bible tells us that it wasn't so popular to be Jewish at this time. Esther must have felt afraid. She may have wondered what God was doing. Eventually, Esther did become the King's wife and she took a big risk in order to save other Jewish people, though it could have cost her her own life. Do you know how she had the strength to make this decision? She prayed- a lot! Sometimes, God may ask you to do something difficult. When we feel afraid, or worry we will be too embarrassed to speak up for what is right, God wants to help us! We need only ask for His help. Prayer is just talking to God! You can do it anywhere, anytime, in your head, out loud- He hears it all. God doesn't promise that every difficult situation will work out in a positive way, or in the way we want. But, He does promise to always be with us.

Prayer :

Talk to God now and tell Him anything that's on your mind. Thank Him for always hearing you and being with you. Ask for His help with any difficult situations you might be facing in your life right now.

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Day 6

Activity :

Draw pictures of all the places you could pray/talk to God. (Here's a hint: it can be anywhere!)

Day 7

Bible Verse:

John 17:18; "As you sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world."

Application :

Did you know that Jesus has given us one of the same jobs that God The Father gave Him? To tell the whole world about Him! After Jesus died on the cross for our sins and rose again, He wanted everyone to know about it! Jesus wants everyone to know that He paid the penalty for their sin on the cross, so that they can have life in Him now AND when they die, by going to live with Him in heaven! So, how do we tell people about Him? Have you ever gotten a new toy or pet and you just couldn't wait to tell friends at church or school about it? It can be the same way with talking about Jesus! Did you read a verse in your Bible that showed you something new about God? Tell your friend at school the next day! Did you learn something new at Awana about God or memorize a new verse? Say the verse or share what you learned with your neighbor friend the next time you play together! God has sent YOU into this world, right where you are, right now. And you can tell others about Him!

Prayer :

Ask God to help you remember to talk about Him. Ask God to bring to your mind someone you know that might need to hear about Him from you.

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Day 7

Activity :

(two large, blank circles) (instructions: write down one thing you've learned about God this week or know to be true about God in the first circle. In the second circle, draw a picture of someone you're going to share it with, or of you standing with someone else talking to them!)

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Day 8

Bible Verse:

Joshua 24:15; “And if it is evil in your eyes to serve the Lord, choose this day whom you will serve, whether the gods your fathers served in the region beyond the River, or the gods of the Amorites in whose land you dwell. But as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord.”

Application :

Joshua was talking to the Israelites in the Old Testament here. The Israelites were finally living in the land that God had promised to give them and Joshua was their leader that God appointed. Joshua wanted the people to remember to serve only God! Just because the people were finally in a beautiful land, living the life God had promised did not mean it was time to forget God and go do whatever they wanted! When things are going good in your life, at school, at home, with your friends, is it sometimes easy to forget about God? It happens to all of us! And Joshua knew that and that was why he gave the Israelites this reminder! Just because things are going well or “smoothly” doesn’t mean we don’t still need God. We need Him always!

Prayer :

Talk to God right now and thank Him for all the wonderful things happening in your life. Ask God for His help to keep praying, keep reading your Bible, and keep talking about Him to others, even when it's easy to forget Him!

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Day 8

Activity :

Grab two pieces of paper. On one piece, draw what you think would be the best day ever. On the second piece, draw some things that might make a really bad day. After you've drawn your pictures, write in big black letters over top, "I need God always!" Now hang them somewhere you'll see them often (above your bed, near your toys in a playroom, etc.) to help you remember to serve God on the good days and the bad!

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Day 9

Bible Verse:

Matthew 18:15- “If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault, between you and him alone. If he listens to you, you have gained your brother.”

Application :

Has anyone ever done anything that hurt you? Maybe you've had a fight with your brother or sister before. Maybe someone at school or church said something mean or unkind to you. I wish this didn't happen, but because everyone is a sinner, at some time or another, someone will do something that hurts us. God knew this and that was why He told us in His Word how we can handle it! Does God tell us to forget about it and just pretend it didn't happen? Does He tell us to fight back and do something mean to the one who hurt us? No! God tells us to go and talk to the person who hurt you. You can tell the person who hurt you, what they did and how it affected you. Why should we do this? So that we can give that person a chance to say they are sorry! If someone hurts us, we usually want to avoid them! But God wants us to talk with that person so that our relationship with them can be fixed! This verse tells us that we “gain our brother (or sister)” by doing this!

Prayer :

Talk with God now about anyone who may have hurt you that you might need to talk with. Ask God to help you be good at saying “I'm sorry” when someone who you might have hurt, comes to talk to you.

Bible Verse:

Philippians 2:16-18- "...holding fast to the word of life, so that in the day of Christ I may be proud that I did not run in vain or labor in vain. Even if I am to be poured out as a drink offering upon the sacrificial offering of your faith, I am glad and rejoice with you all. Likewise you also should be glad and rejoice with me."

Application :

Have you ever been running and started to get tired? Maybe while playing tag or running in a race! Paul, the writer of Philippians, tells us what to do when we get “tired” when following God or just by life! He tells us to “hold fast to the word of life.” What’s that? Paul is talking about God’s Word- the Bible! And Who is the Bible all about? God! Paul is telling us to keep holding onto God and serving Him, so that one day when we see God in heaven, we can be proud of the life we lived for Him. We can only keep serving and loving God through God’s power in us though! This is why Paul tells us to hold fast to God- because He’s the One really doing all the work! So how do we “hold fast?” We do this by reading our Bibles! By praying! By doing what you’re doing right now- reading His Word and learning about Who He is! Keep running, God’s gonna help you!


Prayer :

Ask God:


- To be thankful that Jesus died for us.

Prayer :


- Thank Jesus for this gift!

Day 17

Bible Verse:

Acts 10:39-43; “And we are witnesses of all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree, but God raised him on the third day and made him to appear, not to all the people but to us who had been chosen by God as witnesses, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. And he commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one appointed by God to be judge of the living and the dead. To him all the prophets bear witness that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name.”

Application :

Peter was deep in thought on his rooftop when footsteps and strange voices echoed at the gate. Then he heard it: the Spirit saying, “Three men are looking for you. Go, don’t hesitate!”

Peter’s head spun. First, a strange vision, then mysterious visitors and the voice of God... what was happening? But he simply obeyed and ran to the gate. “I’m the one you’re looking for. Why have you come?”

The men replied, “Cornelius, an officer in the Roman army, sent us. An angel told him to find you and learn the Truth!”

God didn’t send the angel to give the Gospel to Cornelius. He calls people like Peter (and you!) to share the Good News. Peter just needed a nudge from Heaven to share it with people who weren’t Jews like He was.

The truth is, you can and should share Jesus with anyone! No matter how different someone is from you, God promises to be with you every step as you tell others about His life, death, resurrection, and forgiveness of sins.

You don’t need visions, angels, or surprise visitors. Pray, ask God to show you who to share Jesus with, and then — like Peter did for Cornelius — go tell them the Good News!

Bible Verse :

John 4:4-30

John 4:25-26; “The woman said to him, ‘I know that Messiah is coming (he who is called Christ). When he comes, he will tell us all things.’ Jesus said to her, ‘I who speak to you am he.’”

Application :

Sweat trickled down the woman’s forehead as she pulled water from the well. Suddenly, a kind voice said, “Give me a drink.”

She spun around in surprise to find a Jewish man standing there, smiling at her. This was strange. People didn’t usually come to the well at this time of day, and Jews didn’t talk to Samaritans like her. But this man did.

She didn’t know it yet, but the man was Jesus. As they talked, Jesus gently told her things about her life that no one else knew. Then He said something amazing: “I am the Messiah, the One you’ve been waiting for.”

The woman was so excited, she left her water jar behind and ran back to town. She usually avoided people, but not this time. She told everyone, “Come see a man who told me everything I ever did! Could this be the Christ?”

She didn’t know everything about Jesus yet, but she knew enough to share Him. And you can too! Even if you have questions about Him or maybe a hard life story, Jesus can use you. Be like the Samaritan woman. Go, tell, and point people to Jesus!




Bible Verse :

Matthew 5:13-16; “You are the salt of the earth, but if salt has lost its taste, how shall its saltiness be restored? It is no longer good for anything except to be thrown out and trampled under people’s feet. You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do people light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a stand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven.”

Application :

Jesus gathered His followers and shared something surprising. “You are the salt of the earth,” He said. Salt may seem small, but it has an important job. And when salt loses its taste, it can’t do what it was made to do.

Then Jesus said, “You are the light of the world.” He explained that a city on a hill can’t be hidden, and a lamp isn’t meant to be covered up. Instead, it’s placed where it can shine and help everyone see.

Jesus was teaching that people should be able to see God’s love through the way His followers live. When we choose love (even when it’s hard!), we add a good flavor to this world and shine His light. When others see our good works, they praise God!

You don’t have to be loud or famous or even perfect. Every time you choose to do what’s right, you show others what God is like. So don’t hide your faith. Be salty (in the best way), shine bright, and let the world see Jesus in you!



Bible Verse :

Revelation 12:11; “And they have conquered him by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony, for they loved not their lives even unto death.”

Application :

Have you ever felt scared? Maybe of being alone in the dark, performing onstage, or speaking up for what's right when no one else does. Fear can make our hearts beat fast and our minds feel stuck.

In the Bible, God tells us about a great victory over Satan, the enemy who wants God's people to live in fear. God's people conquer the enemy by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony. The Lamb is Jesus, and His blood reminds us that He already won the biggest battle by saving us and forgiving our sins.

God doesn't give us a spirit of fear. When we belong to Jesus, we are never alone, even when things feel scary. And when we talk about what Jesus has done for us, we remind ourselves and others that He is stronger than our fears.

Of course, you don't have to pretend you're not afraid when you are. Instead, you can tell Jesus how you feel and remember what's true: Jesus has already won. When fear shows up, trust Him, speak the Gospel to yourself, and step forward with confidence.

Bible Verse :

Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, ‘Peace be with you. **As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you.**’ And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, ‘Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you withhold forgiveness from any, it is withheld.’”

Application :

After Jesus died on the cross, the disciples were hiding. They locked the doors behind them, afraid of what might happen next. But imagine their surprise when Jesus suddenly appeared among them! “Peace be with you,” He said. Instantly, their fear began to fade. Seeing the wounds on His hands and His side, they were filled with joy. Jesus had risen! But Jesus didn’t stop there. He said, “As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you.” He wasn’t just talking to the disciples. He’s talking to you, too! Jesus gives each of us a mission: to love others and share the Gospel wherever we go.

Jesus also gave the disciples the Holy Spirit, who helps them know what to do and gives them the courage to do it. When we trust the Holy Spirit, we can step out of fear and do the things God calls us to.

You don’t have to wait to be perfect or brave. You’re already sent by Jesus. And you can start small: help a friend and tell them how much God loves them, or show forgiveness to a family member and explain that you can forgive others because of what Jesus did for you on the cross.

The goal? Always looking for ways to share the Gospel with the people in your life! Living sent means letting Jesus work through you every day, wherever you are.
