Title: A Psalm of Great Reversals

Text: Psalm 22

Introduction: A Unique Reversal & Then Fulfillment

Ps. 22:1 // Mark 15:34 - "At the ninth hour Jesus cried out with a loud voice, 'Eloi, Eloi, lama sabachthani?' which is translated, 'My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

- Forsaken is a term most often used to describe Israel's abandonment of God.
- And there is now a unique reversal—the faithful God has forsaken the only truly faithful One.
- Psalm 22: 31 He has done it -> John 19:30 "It is finished!"
 first-person version of Ps. 22:31.

Part I: The Laments - A Great Reversal (vv. 1-21)

- 1-2 See John 5:19: "So Jesus said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, the Son can do nothing of his own accord, but only what he sees the Father doing. For whatever the Father does, that the Son does likewise" (cf. also John 14:8-11).
- 3 Hold on to who you know God to be an Anchor
- 4-5 God's faithfulness to others
- 6-8 Hecklers
- 9-11 God's faithfulness to the psalmist (loneliness)
- 12-13 Threats from the Movers and Shakers
- 14-15 The physical toll

 You lay me in the dust of death who is the "you"?
- 16-18 Graphic descriptions of the cross

Some translations (New Jerusalem Bible) use "bind" instead of pierced - might be a better fit for David

What held Jesus to the cross? (cf. John 3:16; Rom. 5:8)

19-21 The psalmist does the only thing he can do . . . he prays again

Part II: Praise Ignited - A Reversal from Lament to Praise (vv. 21-29)

- 21 God answers
- 22-29 The triumphal celebration (OT practice -> Heavenly Reality)
- 22-29 See Heb. 2:11-12; 5:7

 Maybe the NT book of Hebrews is the expansion pack for Ps. 22:22-29
- For he (God the Father) has not despised or abhorred the affliction of the afflicted (Jesus), and he (God the Father) has not hidden his (God the Father) face from him (Jesus), but has heard when he (Jesus) cried to him (God the Father).

Part III: Congregational Response - A Reversal of the Congregation (vv. 30-31)

Who is the "they"? Who is the "his" or "he"?

What shall they proclaim?

- That he has done it—he has risen, he has risen indeed (Matt. 28:6)
- That he died the death we deserved so that we could live (1 Thess. 5:10)

What then should we do?

- As an observer?
- As someone who is feeling forsaken or as someone who is suffering?
- As someone who has seen God's faithfulness?
