

CROSSPOINT CHURCH VISION STORY 2030

Introduction

This vision story is the result of months of seeking the Holy Spirit's direction through Scripture, prayer, and the wisdom of our people. We listened without rushing to quick fixes or easy answers, asking one central question:

“Based on what we are hearing from the Holy Spirit, where MUST Crosspoint be in five years?”

Our staff processed that question deeply during our 2025 retreat, looking with fresh eyes at our Sunday gatherings, community life, discipleship, family ministries, facilities, and multiplication strategy. Out of this prayerful work, we have written this Vision Story as a commitment to pursue, with God's help, what He is calling us to become.

We believe these next five years will require renewed devotion, sacrificial participation, and a willingness to give ourselves fully for the sake of God's Kingdom. We go forward in total dependence on the Holy Spirit, for the glory of God alone with prayer as the engine that drives every step.

Sunday Worship Gatherings

Vision — To gather every Sunday as a Spirit-filled people who give of themselves fully in worship, fellowship, and service, seeing corporate worship as a joyful sacrifice and privilege.

How we get there — Sunday morning will be marked by full participation in the work of the people—Word and sacrament, corporate singing, invitations to respond, prayer, hospitality, and service. All will be welcomed into a culture of self-giving, where we come not to consume but to contribute.

Crosspoint will be a local church where we understand the why behind our worship. Our people will know and understand the biblical heritage we have been given in our liturgy. More emphasis will be given to our worship being “the work of the people” each time we gather. Sunday mornings will set the precedent for our week as we give ourselves fully to the Lord and to each other.

By 2030, anyone visiting Crosspoint will see a unified people giving Jesus what He alone is worthy of in our worship.

Community Life & Fellowship

Vision — To embody a community life that is a foretaste of the Kingdom — marked by generosity, reconciliation, shared joy and sorrow, and intentional connection.

How we get there — By 2030, the majority of those who attend Sunday worship will also be active in smaller, more intimate fellowship through small groups, men's groups, women's groups, the young adult community, youth group and kids ministry. Each will be rooted in Scripture, prayer, and fellowship, with the purpose of making disciples of Jesus. We will provide space to mourn together, rejoice together, reconcile with one another, and share testimonies of God's faithfulness in our lives.

On-ramps for community life will be clearer and more accessible to newcomers. Intentional systems and training for leaders will be provided so that connecting and welcoming more people to our community will be efficient and culture-shaping. Leaders of our small groups will understand and be unified in their purpose. Our church will be staffed with shepherds competent and gifted to foster this kind of biblical community among us. From the Sunday morning experience to gathering in homes, we will be a people continuing in the apostles's teaching, fellowship, the breaking of bread, and prayers.

By 2030, Crosspoint will be known as a church where deep relationships are the norm, and where every person has a place to connect to the body, develop as a disciple, and be deployed to serve Christ's mission.

Discipleship & Multiplication

Vision — To form disciples who give of themselves fully for the sake of God's Kingdom and who multiply other disciples, groups, and churches.

How we get there — Our disciple-making will be intentional, relational, and prayer-driven. We will bridge relational, cultural, and generational gaps in our community for the purpose of evangelizing unbelievers and making disciples. Those disciples will then be formed and sent as everyday missionaries, church planters, and global missionaries.

By 2030, every new believer will begin with a clear first-step discipleship process that lays the foundation for following Jesus. Those ready for deeper equipping will enter Deploy, learning to discover their calling and make disciples.

We will give our people practical training for engaging unbelievers with the Gospel through everyday life. Small groups, bands, and one-on-one relationships will form the backbone of disciple-making, always infused with prayer and the Word. Our people will know what a disciple is, the one whom we are discipling them to, and how to know when a disciple has been made

We will not be content with adding numbers to our attendance; we will labor to see multiplying disciples sent into the harvest.

Ministry Teams

Vision — To cultivate a unified, prayerful community of Ministry Teams working together efficiently toward the mission of making disciples.

How we get there — Ministry Teams will continue to be vital to Crosspoint's health.

By 2030, these teams will be operating efficiently with shared language and strategy. Every Ministry Team will align under a general purpose of giving of themselves fully in service. Through an intentional process, they will adopt a common vision and vocabulary that keeps the mission of Jesus central. They will operate together in a supportive community with clear communication and collaboration. This will include their gathering regularly for prayer, encouragement and training. New volunteers will always be welcome, training will be efficient, and Ministry Teams will be a primary point of connection for people to the life of the church. By 2030, the majority of those attending will be serving on a Ministry Team.

When Ministry Teams thrive and work together, the whole church will experience greater unity and effectiveness in mission.

Families, Kids, & Youth

Vision — To be a church where families are cherished, kids are included in the life of the church, and the next generation is equipped to follow Jesus and give themselves fully to His mission.

How we get there — We will treat ministry to kids and youth as central to our mission. Parents and caregivers will be equipped as the primary disciplers of their children. Kids and youth will be integrated into moments of worship, discipleship, and obedience to Jesus' Great Commission. Evangelistic opportunities will be

extended to our children and youth to reach families, classmates, and teammates. Rites of passage will commence greater responsibility and opportunities to serve as kids and youth grow and mature in their faith. We will commit to intentional care and discipleship for the orphan, those without strong family support, and those with special needs.

By 2030, kids will have space to grow, serve, and lead; youth will be known as contributors to the mission; and the whole church will celebrate the discipleship of entire households.

Facilities & Property

Vision — To steward spaces that serve the mission, reflect radical hospitality, and provide for the needs of all generations.

How we get there — Our buildings and property will continue to function, not as what draws people to our ministry, but as important tools useful for ministry.

In the next five years, we will establish a dedicated youth space, provide space for special needs ministry, increase our kids ministry's footprint, and improve workspace efficiency for staff and ministry leaders. We will ensure that our current spaces are warm, organized, and welcoming. We will seek to secure permanent, sufficient parking. All the while, we will cover the entire process in prayer, and trust that God will provide through the generosity of His people.

We will trust God will shape our facilities into places where people encounter Jesus, disciples are formed, and where all are welcome.
