# 4G MINISTRIES

## 2 Timothy 2:2

**"Partnering with churches and missionaries in disciple-making, leadership-training, and church-planting."**

Dear 4G Ministries Supporter:

The expression "third time's a charm" originated in Ireland in the 1830s and was later adopted in American speech. It suggests that something will succeed or turn out better on the third attempt. You may wonder what this expression has to do with my mission newsletter. I just returned from conducting my third expository preaching workshop in Belize, and I must confess the third time was a charm.

**In September 2024**, I conducted my first expository preaching workshop in Belize. On other occasions, I had taught courses like How to Study the Bible, Bible Study Methods, and Sermon Preparation. Although the preaching improved, the missionary and I were not seeing the results that we wanted. So I told him if we wanted to help the pastors on a long-term basis, we needed to focus on teaching them how to prepare expository sermons. So the missionary Wayne Anderson, told me to do whatever I wanted to do to make it happen. I decided to conduct my expository preaching workshop and change the strategy of how we were teaching the pastors. We brought in tables and placed the pastors in groups of six. Each table had a lead pastor who knew the English language and grammar. I remember so well the difficulty of taking a paragraph of Scripture and showing them how to divided it into an outline. It was hands-on teaching that was difficult for them as well as for me. But we pressed on knowing this was the will of the Lord. Each group of pastors worked on sermons together. At the end of the week, I could see some progress, but not enough to leave them on their own. I told them we would do another workshop and they were excited.

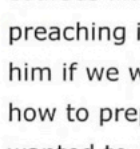
**In March 2025**, I conducted my second workshop on expository preaching. Again, I placed them in groups of six with a leader at each table. But this time, toward the end of the week, each pastor began to work on their own sermon with no help from the others. As I graded their sermons, I could see they were improving in their notes and in building a good outline. At the end of the workshop, I encouraged them to prepare nothing but expository sermons. The missionary looked at their outlines when he returned in May 2025 and was very pleased with their progress.

**In September 2025**, at the request of the missionary, I conducted my third expository preaching workshop. But this time, I changed the model so that each pastor was required to prepare his own sermons using nothing but an English dictionary, Strong's Bible Concordance, and their Thompson Chain Reference Bible. Each pastor prepared and turned in four sermons during the workshop. We worked from 7:30 am until 6:00 pm each day. There was not one complaint all week about how long we worked. And many of the pastors worked in the church on their sermons after the evening meal. I saw great progress after each sermon. So I decided on the last day of the workshop, to select seven of the best sermons that I graded. I asked each pastor to explain in their own language the process they followed to prepare their sermons. Each pastor shared and answered questions from the other pastors. As the missionary and I witnessed what they were doing, I told him this is the way it is supposed to be. These seven pastors will do the next workshop.

One of the great joys during the week was teaching a fifteen year old Ket'chi preacher who had recently surrendered to the ministry. He was invited by one of our pastors who had preached in his father's church. He said he would be at every school from now on.

Greeting you all in the name of our Savior Jesus Christ,

We are again so thankful for your prayers and continual support in the work here in the Philippines. By God's grace we are striving together as a church doing evangelism and discipleship here in Cabatuan, Iloilo. The past four months has been filled with events and continual building of the temporary sanctuary where we are planning to move to between the last week of August and the middle week of September. The building process is affected by the weather we have lately. For the last two weeks we experienced four severe tropical storms, but God has protected us and the church people are doing good recovering from it. Here are the activities we had since April and in the next two pages are pictures of these events.

1. Evangelistic Sunday (7-10 people professed of their faith in Jesus. we also got the opportunities to distribute BEAMS Bible.)
2. Youth Camp 2025 (5 young people accepted Jesus as their Savior the first night and God has challenged many young people to live the life God wanted them to have.) Our theme this year is "Breaking Chains /Mending Links". we had 200+ youth from 18 churches who participated.
3. Six of our Church Youth graduated from GSEF College and are faithful in attending church and serving the Lord as choir member and youth leaders. One lady entered GSEF as an office staff with the desire to be a Missionary.
4. We participated and had delegates for the Basketball Clinic held by American Coaches that is annually held in our town, specifically in GSEF College and now on the process of following up these young kids who joined.
5. We are able to commission/send out one local Pastor to Church plant in the town called Dumangas, his name is Pastor Adrian. he was saved, baptized and discipled in Cabatuan Baptist Church. it was a blessed time. he just had his first service first Sunday of July.
6. Our church organized one of our daughter church to be an Independent Church (Shalom Baptist Church under the leadership of Pastor Genesis) it was an exciting time to see them celebrate this landmark in their young history.
7. We celebrated Mothers in May and appreciated our Fathers in June.

God bless you, we love you and we strongly covet your prayers here in Cabatuan, Iloilo, Philippines. we are still in the process of constructing Sunday school classrooms, restrooms, kitchen, offices and the slant ramp or stairs.

God sure has been good to us! The Lord has given us opportunities to preach, sing and present the work in many churches! Just in the month of August we traveled over 10,000 miles and not even a flat tire! Ain't God Good! We have preached mission conferences, revivals, homecomings, camp meetings, Bible conferences, brotherhood services and wild game feast in the last few months! Denise sings at most of our services and she has several ladies' meetings to speak at in the next month! We are amazed at the doors God has opened! We praise Him!

In our last letter we mentioned a little boy named William and his battle with cancer. William is the son of one of our teachers at the College. He needed medical treatment, and they did not have the money for the treatment. We were able to send the money needed for his treatment, but by the time William got to the hospital the cancer had progressed and soon took his life. We are heartbroken for his family. I do ask you to pray for this precious family. Several people sent offerings regarding the cost of medical bills. Thank you all who were able to give towards that need. We were able to cover the cost of all the medical bills, the funeral and memorial service.

In December I will travel to Kenya and Uganda, Africa! Bro Kevin Noles is a missionary to Uganda and has some meetings planned during the month of December. I have been invited to preach in a Bible Institute and some youth meetings. Please pray that this trip brings glory and honor to the Lord!

Denise and I will travel to the border of Nepal / India in the month of February for some extended meetings with our Indian staff. We also will help in some Pastor meetings with Brother Chad Sellers while there.

The colleges are doing well, and the Lord has sent us more students than we have ever had! We have 70 students enrolled at LCBBC located in Telangana and 50 students at AGGBBC located in Nagaland! The work in Manipur has resumed and is doing well also, as the unrest there has settled down some! The churches we have helped plant are doing well!

Dear Pastor and friends,

Psa. 150:6 says, "Let everything that hath breath praise the LORD...". There is no question the Spirit of the Lord is using the radio ministry to reach people in the "deep bush" and also in Guatemala. We now have 3 pastors preaching on the radio which covers over half of Belize and part of Guatemala. People in "radioland" are contacting our radio preachers wanting to be saved.

Our street preacher in Guatemala City, Bro. Pablo Ixcoy, who was preaching on a portable loudspeaker, had approximately 15 people, who were leaving a Catholic church service stop and ask him to come to their home and explain about this man "Jesus". They had never heard the plan of salvation. We praise God for this.

Bro. Stanley Kilgore did an excellent job in teaching the pastors in our Pastors School how to preach expository messages. He also had some of the older pastors preach their messages back to him and the other pastors in the school. It was encouraging to see the improvement they have made. Bro. Jose Salam did an outstanding job in preaching and explaining how expository preaching is so important to help believers in their church. He really took time to explain to the pastors from Guatemala, who only understand the Kekchi language. Bro. Jose is just a natural, gifted teacher. We teach a lot of things in our Pastors School but there are 2 things we focus on: Soulwinning and Spiritual Growth in the church. Bro. Stanley also preached and explained Ezekiel Chapters 37-38. The pastors were stunned as they heard about the end times.

We have had 22 people accept Jesus Christ as their Savior. One lady and her daughter traveled over 100 miles to talk to Bro. Eleuterio Mes about salvation after hearing him on the radio. She described her salvation as a miracle from God. We had 40 pastors in attendance at our Pastors School. About 8 more pastors were not able to come due to health problems, etc. We are seeing the next generation of preachers in our school. Our youngest preacher is a 15 year old boy, named Marlon, who is coming to every school to learn to study his bible and preach. We are including a picture of our oldest pastor, Bro. Juan Teul, who is 79, and our youngest, Marlon. Praise the Lord for this young man.



It seems that Satan has intensified his fight to stop the gospel. We are in the process of building a double fence and installing solar lights around our facility. Satan is working night and day to hinder the work of getting the gospel out to the lost. We had to hire a guard at night while building this fence.

It was a blessing not to have water and generator problems this time. All of our water vats were overflowing and the generator ran all week with no problems. Praise the Lord! Thank you for your prayers and support of this ministry. May God bless you.
