What does God want from You in 2026?

1. Live Wisely and Walk Carefully.

2. Leverage Your Time Because Time is a Gift—Not a Guarantee.

3. Long to do God's Will.

Ephesians 5:17, NLT - ¹⁷ Don't act thoughtlessly, but understand what the Lord wants you to do.

How do we accomplish this?

STUDY VERSE SECTION - Ephesians 5:18, NASB95 - ¹⁸ And do not get drunk [the Greek word means "to be excited by something"] with wine [a fermented drink], for that is dissipation [the Greek word means "something that does not save;" we get our English Word "rot" from this word], but be filled [this Greek word means "to be completely seized by something via surrender"] with the Spirit....

A **Drunk** is excited by drink
....is influenced by drink
...loses control by surrender
...has temporary happiness
...does stupid embarrassing things

A **Believer** is excited by Christ
....is influenced by the Holy Spirit
...gains control via surrender
...has lasting happiness
Spirit-filled believers glorify God.
