
2025: A Year in Review

Description of the ministry:

Cornerstone's vision for life groups is that we help each other become more like Jesus Christ, loving God above all else and sacrificially loving others. We believe the path to mature discipleship is found through relationship with others. To this end we seek to gather our congregation into small groups to share life together as a spiritual family.



- Life Groups are the primary way to share life together at Cornerstone. It is one of the few ministries we have that is intergenerational and we say if you have time for only one thing besides Sunday morning, this is it.
- Leaders have started to be trained to be more in a shepherding role than a facilitator role.
- We changed to a semester-based model.
- Life Groups moved from being under Pastor Dave to being under a committee.

- ▶ Marriage is a vital relationship in our families, the church, and our community. At Cornerstone we want to see thriving marriages and we are offering re | engage to help us move towards that goal of thriving marriages at Cornerstone and in our community. Re | engage is a discipleship ministry in the context of marriage. Through a growing relationship with Christ and a deepening understanding of God's love for us our marriages can grow in intimacy and vulnerability. At re | engage meetings there is a large group time with teachings and testimonies. There is also a small group time with the opportunity for vulnerability and support with other couples as well as dedicated time to talk with your spouse about the lesson and concepts that you are learning together.
- ▶ Almost 70 couples have gone through re | engage since we began and we have seen a growing percentage of our couples coming from outside of Cornerstone and some unchurched couples as well! We plan to continue offering re | engage in the spring and fall each year. If you are interested in going through re | engage you can talk to Tim and Julie Malone or Seth and Jill Watts. Whether you would rate your marriage on a scale of 1-10 as a 2 or an 8 this is a ministry for everyone, and we would encourage you to join us.

Men's Ministry



A record 44 men from Cornerstone attended the men's retreat. Cornerstone continues to play the role of leader in organizing and hosting the annual Men's retreat with several churches providing support through our committee. Gary Seydell who passed in October was an instrumental part of the committee and actively assisted in making the retreat a reality. Our speaker Dr. Pete provided a challenging message on what it means to be a man by God's standard and not the world's with many men being strongly impacted.

- We had more than 80 men attend our annual Men's breakfast with our speaker Matt Maher. He challenged our concept of redemption and forgiveness and how God can use the worst moments in our lives for his glory.
- Forge on Tuesdays - Because of the Men's Retreat and the conviction of the message from the speaker, we are now live streaming Forge from Florida. This is a great opportunity for men to be challenged, hear a message, and meet with other men enhancing their relationships with other men and most importantly our Lord and Savior. We hope to grow this small group of about a dozen men into a large group.
- Our winter men's Sunday School averaged 37 attendees. This winter there will be a class based on Dr. Pete's book, "Like Father, Like Son: How Knowing God as Father Changes Men."

- ▶ Challenge - Assure we support each widow at the point of her current widow's journey
- ▶ Goal for 2026 - Expand activities to include a visitation program for shut-ins and others who may wish a friendly visitor



- ▶ Approx. 30 moms and 50 kids. Half from cornerstone half from the community
- ▶ Relationships are being clearly developed in the group
- ▶ Wonderful synergy with the preschool/ co-op community
- ▶ A group of moms often stay after the MomCo meetings to hang out in the park or gym
- ▶ Leadership team works really well together and supports one another:)
- ▶ New moms are continuing to join!

Fiber Arts

- ▶ Our Fiber Arts Ministry combines knitting/crocheting (etc.) with prayer to create tangible gifts of comfort and love.
- ▶ These items are given to someone experiencing spiritual upheaval, to someone who is ill, to someone who is grieving, to someone in need of comfort and prayer, to shut-ins and hospital patients.
- ▶ Shawls, lap blankets or throws, hats, baby "Lovey's," and more, whether knit, crocheted, sewn, woven, or quilted are started with intentional prayers and worked by our talented, gifted, prayer warrior members so that every stitch is a prayer.
- ▶ The ministry reaches out to men, women, and children, providing comfort and care to anyone in need. Each item is made either for a specific person and/or a specific need. Most importantly we are given the privilege to pray for people.
- ▶ Through our prayer shawl ministry, we hope to be an active part of our church community as it comes together to spread the gospel via love, hope, and support.
