Key Scriptures

Luke 15:1-7 Luke 19:10 2 Peter 3:9

Message Summary

In The Parable of the Lost Sheep, Jesus teaches us the value of ONE in God's Kingdom. Discovering that one of his sheep is lost, the Good Shepherd leaves His flock of ninety-nine to search for it—a choice that defies human logic but reflects the heart of God.

Jesus' parable was a direct challenge to the audience of religious leaders that day, who valued rules more than they valued people. In their eyes, sinners were dismissed as unworthy of love, time, energy. Jesus paints a picture of a shepherd who notices just one sheep missing and refuses to rest until it is found. For Jesus, the ONE lost sheep is not a distraction from the mission. It is the mission! In the Kingdom of God, every person is priceless. And when a lost soul is found, heaven rejoices!

Jesus is that Good Shepherd for us—pursuing us, finding us, and rejoicing over us when we're brought home. Now that we know the deep love and kindness of the Good Shepherd, it's our turn to live with the same heart: to notice those who are lost and broken around us, to focus on the ONE within our spheres of influence, and to celebrate when the lost are found again. May we not become so comfortable in the safe arms of the Good Shepherd that we forget about His lost children out there. Who is your ONE?
