

Use the following thoughts and questions to have a spiritual conversation as a family. Don't emphasize having the right answer, but focus on spending time discussing the Word as a family.

SCRIPTURE | 1 Kings 10:1-10

SESSION SUMMARY

When Solomon took the throne, we know he asked God for wisdom and God granted that—to the point that it was obvious to surrounding nations. Another ruler, whom Scripture calls the Queen of Sheba, came to visit Solomon because she was curious about his wisdom and how his fame was connected to God. We'll see that if we know Christ, then it should be evident to others. Here are the main takeaways:

- Wisdom is evidence of our relationship with God (1 Kings 10:1-7).
- The evidence points people to Christ (1 Kings 10:8-10).

CONVERSATION QUESTIONS

- · Who do we know who's faith and wisdom stands out? What makes it stand out?
- What is some evidence in our family's life that God cares for us? Why do you think it can be difficult to remember that God cares for our family?
- · How can sharing God's wisdom and care for us draw others to Him?

FAMILY CHALLENGE

Assign one person as the Journalist, who writes down what others say. Write numbers for each family member on small slips of paper, fold them in half, place them in a cup, and mix them. Whatever number someone draws is the order he or she will be in the Witness Stand. The Journalist can swap roles when it's his or her turn. For each witness, the rest of the group gets thirty seconds to call out as many things as they can that they know, without any doubt, that person loves. This can be simple loves, like ice cream, or bigger loves, like travel, family, or Jesus. The Journalist will record the witness's name and what the group says about him or her. At the end, review what was said about each person, discussing what's accurate. Explain that when we follow Jesus, our faith should be evident to others.
