Hello Grove Level!

Hello! Man, I hadn't realized how long ago our last update was-apologies. Time when you get acclimated to the bush life is very abstract, mostly because life is slow yet busy and it's easy to go a while without checking your phone or emails. Clearly! We've got some fun updates for you, and as always are deeply grateful for your faithful prayers.

As of our last update, we had just launched our house church! It is Galena Community Fellowship, and we also have a kids Sunday School. Already, we've had other families - some who go to the Catholic Church here but are not Catholic (fairly common in Galena), some unbelievers who think it's good for their kiddo, and some unchurched families come and bring their kiddos to learn and grow in their understanding of God and His love. That is a surprising thing, since we didn't really think a lot of doing Sunday School. We mainly set up the kids Sunday school for our own kiddos but were of course reminded that God is a mover and shaker! So now we have some wonderful kiddos who come every Sunday to hear from the Bible, do crafts, activities and games and pray together as they learn how much God loves them.

For the adult house church that follows, we've been enjoying our time immensely! What a praise that God keeps His promises. His yoke is easy, and His burden is light. We've settled into a wonderful rhythm. We do 6-week studies, a seventh-week fellowship/worship Sunday so Ross can have a Sabbath and fellowship himself, and then we do a Serving Sunday where we go out into the community and DO something. Clean a house, chop wood, lend a hand, serve a need. We just had our first one this past week, and we met up at the main boat launch in the horizontal rain at 43*F and picked up loads of glass, trash, box cutters, rusted pipes, etc., that were littered there. It was a fun way to serve in a tangible way!

We were surprised when a main couple who attend did not show up though to our Serving Sunday. Turns out, simultaneously she was going into labor at 36 weeks at our local clinic. THIS DOES NOT HAPPEN HERE. Women are to go to town (Fairbanks or Anchorage) for the final month of pregnancy as an insurance requirement and because of risks/number of appointments needed in town. Her flight in for her "waiting month" was the following morning. Instead, she delivered her first born baby boy IN GALENA in a very fast 45 minute breech birth. Both mama and baby almost died, but praise God for our clinic staff and for God's hand over them. They are doing well. They were life-flighted to Fairbanks and continue to wait for their sweet boy to graduate from the NICU where he is having trouble with breathing.

Please be praying for that young couple and their new baby: Ashley and Will Kramer and their baby boy Garrett.
