DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. What does this passage teach us about the relationship between sound teaching and Godly living? Can you have “sound teaching” but no “godly living”? What about the reverse?
2. What are some of the traits listed for older Christians? Why are these qualities specifically vital for the older members of a church? What happens to a church’s culture when the older members lack spiritual depth or self-control?
3. Who does the discipling in verses 4 and 6? Why do you think Paul emphasizes peer-to-peer or generational discipleship rather than just having the pastor teach everyone? Looking at these verses, what “ministry” do you currently have in this church? Are you currently in a relationship where you are being poured into, or pouring into someone else?

4. Paul tells Titus to “declare these things; exhort and rebuke with all authority.” Why is it sometimes difficult for you to accept “rebuke” or “exhortation”? If we asked your family or closest friends, would they say you are a person who receives conviction and correction with grace? Do you have a “deep enough” relationship with anyone here to sustain that kind of honesty?

5. What part of this passage is the Holy Spirit highlighting as an area for your growth right now?
