This had to be what the disciples felt like at the Passover meal. We are taking 3 months to examine what Jesus' last week was leading up to His death and resurrection according to the Gospel of John, and the vast majority of that portion of scripture was presented to the disciples in a matter of a few hours! Can you even imagine?! They were definitely "drinking from the firehose"!

As we continue to study what Jesus had to say to His disciples, we will continue to read major amounts of helpful instructions for when He is no longer physically with them. All of His words to the disciples are also for us as well. It might seem overwhelming to you to think about putting into practice all Jesus taught His disciples that last night; don't worry, it was very overwhelming for them too!

May I encourage you to look at the examples of the disciples after Jesus returned to Heaven. They focused on the "majors" of Jesus message to them: to love the Lord with everything (Matt 22:37); love others how he loved us (John 13:34); to Abide in Him (John 15:1-17); to rely on the power of the Holy Spirit (John 14:24-25, Acts 2 Cor 3:17-18); to continue to pray, and then pray some more (all through Acts). As we approach Easter this year, I encourage you to continue to focus on the majors! Love God above all, love others, Abide in Him, be guided always by the Holy Spirit, and PRAY!!
