I am also amazed at her witness at her various workplaces (both formerly in the Northwestern Guidance office and currently at the Main Street Cakery). Kelly has always seen her "job" as her "mission field"---if you are currently one of her customers, you know this!

I can truly and gratefully say that anything good and praiseworthy that has been accomplished during my years of ministry here at the church, has been the result of the <u>grace</u> of God and the "blessing" of the teammate that He gave me by bringing Kelly into my life! I don't want to be over sentimental here, but on many occasions she was the "wind beneath my wings" (yep, that old Bette Midler song!)....she loved and cared for me often <u>more</u> than I deserved. Kelly is a wife of "noble character" (Proverbs 31) and as such, I as her husband want to "arise and call her blessed" (Prov. 31:28)

OCC SHOEBOXES

Our final focus of Operation Christmas Child is

Multiplication. After Evangelism at the initial Gospel presentation and guiding the children through the Greatest Journey Discipleship course, the children then are sharing the Good News with those in their families, neighborhoods, villages and schools. This shows that the boxes we send reach more than one child with the gospel. Evangelism, Discipleship and Multiplication has been so effective in reaching around the world and spreading the Gospel. What an awesome ministry that we can participate in as we pack our boxes.

This month our item is ministry/shipping costs. While it might not sound exciting, it is essential in the process of getting the gift-filled box from here to its destination. Samaritan's Purse requests a suggested \$10 donation per box. It is truly a ministry cost when you see what it covers-so much more than shipping. It covers collection costs, processing each box, shipping (as on a ship or plane-not the US Postal Service), and a Gospel booklet printed in the child's own language. Also the \$10 goes towards helping to train and equip the local churches to hold outreach events where the boxes are distributed. When you see all that the \$10 covers, it is amazing. To help us collect our shipping costs for our 500 boxes to be done at our packing party, we are holding a fundraiser. On September 14th and 21st there will be an Operation Christmas Child display in the Welcome Center. We will have envelopes for you to take to sponsor a box or boxes. Checks can be made payable to the Federated Church.

We have a list of some needed items and it will be posted near the OCC collection box in the

Welcome Center and updated weekly. Thank you for your generous donations all year long!
