

On a warm and rainy evening in August of 1952 in a tiny lopsided plank-and-nail auditorium, described by some as "a cross between a barn and a country church," pianist David Tudor sat down to perform what was provisionally entitled: "Four Pieces."

He starts a stopwatch, sits down in front of the piano, closes the lid and begins a performance of composer John Cage's artistic piece, '4'33"' in which he never plays a note. After 30 seconds of silence, Tudor resets the stopwatch and times another two minutes, 23 seconds of silence, then another one minute, 40 seconds of silence. The now famous 4 minutes and 33 second composition by Cage is considered both a work of art, and a joke.

I recently learned of Cage's famous and infamous composition while preparing my funeral homily for a 42 year old mother who leaves behind a seven year old daughter and husband, who are deeply grieving what cancer has robbed from them.

Advent—a season of waiting and preparing—comes amid the winter solstice when the world grows a little more quiet. One of my favorite things to do in the winter is hike at night after a freshly fallen snow. The beauty and silence are overwhelming.

I often begin funeral services by quoting God from Psalm 46:10, "Be still, and know that I am God." Stillness, silence, quiet... can be both satisfying and empty, just like Cage's composition, silence can be both a gift, and a cruel joke.


As a gift silence quiets an otherwise chaotic life, but it also creates space for racing thoughts, unanswered questions, and the painful awareness of what I cannot control. So how are we, in this season of "silent nights," supposed to experience the good?

Cage's silent composition was no joke, and it would have an incalculable, if characteristically quiet, influence on a great deal of music that came after, even to today, and it was inspired by an experience he had with silence. In his famous collection of essays titled "Silence," Cage wrote about once entering an anechoic chamber at Harvard intended to eliminate all sound, but he heard two sounds, one high and one low. The engineer of duty informed him that the high-pitched sound was that of his nervous system, the low one that of his blood in circulation.

In the silence we can be overwhelmed by the screeching synaptic firing of our own thoughts trying to control, direct, answer, and solve life's greatest challenges. Or, we can focus on the deep circulation of grace flowing from God's heart which is Emmanuel—God with us.

I may not always be able to make sense of life, but I can always sense the beauty of God's love in life by, in the silence, focusing on whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy (Philippians 4:8).

### Environmental Talk by Mary Gillingham




Several weeks ago, I attended a WUMC Youth Group gathering to invite the youth to participate in a project launching in early 2026. The project involves recycling #5 prescription bottles and sending them to Matthew 25



Ministries in Ohio. A collection tub will be available in the Sanctuary next to the container for plastic lid recycling. You may remove the label if you wish. The youth will collect the bottles, remove the labels and adhesive residue, and then wash and dry them. This project is part of a larger effort involving several churches in McDonough County and is being coordinated by the Faith-Based Creation Care Committee (FBCC).

After saying goodbye to 16 graduates in May, we've welcomed many new students and continue to serve 30–40 people each week through our Sunday and Tuesday dinners.
