






PASTORAL LETTER

pastor don

This new year brings new beginnings, and with it I hope for fresh commitments, deeper trust, renewed hope, and passionate growth for us here at Wesley UMC. At the heart of our church's life is a simple but powerful mission: "to help people cultivate a growing, personal relationship with God through Christ." This mission continues to guide us as we look ahead, calling one another to choose an intentional path of faith through worship, study, fellowship and service.

Wesley UMC is named for the founding brothers of Methodism—John and Charles Wesley—and so, I am turning to the words of John and Charles to illuminate our path as we begin our journey.

In his hymn "Soldiers of Christ, Arise," (he wrote over 2,000 hymns) Charles

Wesley wrote of worship: "In Fellowship, alone to God, with faith, draw near, approach His courts, besiege His throne with all the power of Prayer." Our faith journey begins in worship and is continually renewed by it. When we gather in fellowship, we're reminded who God is and who we are in God's grace. Through prayer, song, Scripture, proclamation, and praise, worship shapes our hearts and aligns our lives in the shared purpose God has for us. Choosing to worship regularly is more than a habit—it is an act of love and trust, placing God at the center of our days, our decisions, and our connections.

John Wesley said, "Though we cannot think

Christ's love to one another and to the world. Choosing fellowship is choosing connection, compassion, and shared purpose.

Finally, the Wesley Covenant Prayer, which Methodists often use to start the year says, "I am no longer my own, but yours. Put me to what you will, place me with whom you will. Put me to doing, put me to suffering. Let me be put to work for you or set aside for you... I freely and fully surrender all things to your glory and service." Service to God and others, not self, and service to the greater good of the gospel is at the heart of our Christian faith. John Wesley is famously

alike, may we not love alike? May we not be of one heart, though we are not of one opinion? Without all doubt, we may. Herein all the children of God may unite, notwithstanding these smaller differences." Study, both personal and communal, invites us to grow deeper in understanding and faith. Through devotion, study and dialogue, we invite the Holy Spirit to teach, challenge, and transform us. Bible studies, study groups, personal devotion, and the like equip us to live out our faith with wisdom, confidence, and most of all, grace. In the new year, choosing study means choosing to be rooted, connected, growing, and strengthened in Christ.

John also said, "Beware you be not swallowed up in books! An ounce of love is worth a pound of knowledge." Fellowship is more than just getting together. It reminds us that faith is not meant to be lived alone. When we connect with one another in shared opportunities to know joy, laughter, and love, we're reminded God has created

us for community, and the church is a place where relationships encourage, support, and inspire us. Through fellowship, we share joys and burdens, serve together, and reflect

When the tree went up with 100 tags, each representing a child in need, we didn't know how long it would take to place them all. But one by one, the tags disappeared, taken by caring hands ready to bring joy to a child this Christmas.

Then something especially meaningful happened. The final tag was taken by a woman named Leslie, who had never participated in an Angel Tree before. After seeing a recent video shared through Wesley social media, she felt compelled to stop by the church, walk through our doors, and choose a child to bless. Her simple act of kindness completed the tree—and beautifully illustrated the reach of our shared story.
