


To help us plan, we encourage you to sign up in advance. You can do so after Sunday services in the Atrium or by calling the church office. Signing up is not required but greatly appreciated.

# Environmental Talk by Mary Gillingham



At least 14 tons of plastic trash end up in God's oceans each year. The GREAT PACIFIC GARBAGE PATCH is located between Hawaii and California and covers 1.6 million square kilometers—an area twice as big as Texas. It contains an



estimated 1.8 TRILLION PIECES OF PLASTIC, which weigh almost 90,000 tons.

Plastic tends to stay within 100 miles of shore, and scientists estimate that 99% of plastic is under the surface of the ocean. This does not even account for the plastic in landfills. Only around 9% is recycled, 12% is incinerated, and 79% accumulates in landfills. Many of the things we label as "trash" are really stewardship failures to treat God's creation as He does, which is our calling as images of God here on earth.

A good first step to take is to take THE LAST STRAW CAMPAIGN PLEDGE. We can start by not using disposable plastic straws and lids. It may not seem like much, but even one straw can adversely impact the life of God's sea creatures such as sea turtles.

Tags for our Angel Tree will be available in the early part of November! Each tag represents a child in need this Christmas. You can choose a tag and shop for that child—or, if you prefer, you may make a monetary donation, and our Youth Group will shop on your behalf.

# Helping Meet Growing Needs in Our Community

The need for food assistance in our community continues to grow. The Good Food Pantry reports that from September 2023 to September 2024, the number of families served has increased by 31%—from 335 families (884 individuals) last year to 440 families (1,173 individuals) this year.

With the possibility that SNAP benefits may be ending or temporarily paused, many in our community are feeling uncertain and anxious about how they will make ends meet. At the time of printing, we are unsure how this situation will unfold, but we know the impact could be significant for local families.

There are several ways you can help meet this growing need: consider donating to or volunteering with the Good Food Pantry, or supporting Loaves and Fishes once their food voucher program reopens. Wesley is also praying about how we can respond and do our part as a congregation to help care for our neighbors during this time of increased need.
