Exodus 16:1-36

- b. How does God provide meat and bread for Israel?
- c. How do the people react when they first see the manna?

3. Verses 16-30

- a. What instructions does God give for gathering manna each day?
- b. What happens when some people ignore God's commands?
- c. Why is the sixth day different, and what does it teach about the Sabbath?

4. Verses 31-36

- a. How is manna described in these verses?
- b. Why does God command a jar of manna to be kept?
- c. How long did Israel eat manna, and what does this show about God's faithfulness?

How to Study God's Word Effectively:

Remember the simple yet powerful approach we've learned:

- 1. Soak in the Passage
 - Read the passage multiple times. Each time, pray and ask God to speak to you—inviting His Spirit to give you insight, clarity, and understanding.
- 2. Follow the O.I.A. Method:
 - Observation Write down everything you notice in the text, even the simplest details. Don't overlook the obvious—just note what you see.
 - Interpretation What do those observations mean? Seek to understand the message and context of what you've written down.
 - Application Based on what you've read and understood, how does this truth apply to your life? What is God calling you to believe, change, or do?
