Exodus Study #2

Exodus 2:1-25

1. Verses 1-10

- a. What risks did Moses' family take to protect him, and what does that teach us about trusting God in hard times?
- b. How did God use the courage and compassion of ordinary women?
- c. Where do you see God working behind the scenes, in this story and in your own life?
- d. Why might God have placed Moses in Pharaoh's household, and how does that encourage you about His preparation?

2. Verses 11-22

- a. Why did Moses react so strongly to an Egyptian beating a Hebrew? What do Acts 7:23–25 reveal about his thinking?
- b. How is the Hebrew's rejection of Moses similar to the rejection Jesus faced at His first coming?
- c. What might God be teaching us during "wilderness" seasons?
- d. What does the name "Gershom" reveal about how Moses felt, and how does God meet us when we feel like strangers?

3. Verses 23-25

- a. What encourages you about God hearing His people's cries?
- b. What does it mean that God "remembered" His covenant, and how can that strengthen your faith and give you hope while waiting?

How to Study God’s Word Effectively:

Remember the simple yet powerful approach we’ve learned:

1. Soak in the Passage
 - Read the passage multiple times. Each time, pray and ask God to speak to you—inviting His Spirit to give you insight, clarity, and understanding.
2. Follow the O.I.A. Method:
 - **Observation** – Write down everything you notice in the text, even the simplest details. Don’t overlook the obvious—just note what you see.
 - **Interpretation** – What do those observations mean? Seek to understand the message and context of what you’ve written down.
 - **Application** – Based on what you’ve read and understood, how does this truth apply to your life? What is God calling you to believe, change, or do?
