Exodus Study #3

Exodus 3:1-22

1. Verses 1-6

- a. Who spoke to Moses during his time as a shepherd, and what was unusual about this encounter?
- b. What does God's command to remove his sandals teach us about approaching Him with reverence and humility?
- c. Why is it significant that God calls Moses by name, and what does that say about how He personally relates to us?

2. Verses 7-12

- a. What does this passage reveal about God's compassion for Israel?
- b. How does Moses' reluctance mirror the fears and insecurities we often feel when God calls us?
- c. How does God's promise "I will certainly be with you" give us courage to obey even when we feel unqualified?

3. Verses 13-22

- a. Why is God's name "I AM" important, and how does knowing He is the same today impact your faith?
- b. How does God's plan to deliver His people remind you of His power to free us from what enslaves us?
- c. Why would God prepare Moses by telling him Pharaoh would resist?
- d. What helps you trust God when His plans seem slow or difficult?

How to Study God’s Word Effectively:

Remember the simple yet powerful approach we’ve learned:

1. Soak in the Passage
 - Read the passage multiple times. Each time, pray and ask God to speak to you—inviting His Spirit to give you insight, clarity, and understanding.
2. Follow the O.I.A. Method:
 - **Observation** – Write down everything you notice in the text, even the simplest details. Don’t overlook the obvious—just note what you see.
 - **Interpretation** – What do those observations mean? Seek to understand the message and context of what you’ve written down.
 - **Application** – Based on what you’ve read and understood, how does this truth apply to your life? What is God calling you to believe, change, or do?
