Exodus Study #5

Exodus 5:1-23

1. Verses 1-5

- a. What does God command Pharaoh to do, and how does Pharaoh respond?
- b. What does Pharaoh's answer in verse 2 reveal about his attitude toward God?
- c. How can Moses and Aaron's courage and obedience encourage us when we face opposition?

2. Verses 6-14

- a. What new command does Pharaoh give regarding the Israelites' work?
- b. Why do you think God allows things to get harder for Israel right after sending Moses?
- c. How can we keep trusting God when obedience seems to make life more difficult?

3. Verses 15-23

- a. Who do the Israelite officers cry out to, and who do they blame for the increased burden?
- b. How does Moses respond to God in verses 22-23?
- c. What can we learn from Moses about bringing our struggles and questions to God?

How to Study God’s Word Effectively:

Remember the simple yet powerful approach we’ve learned:

1. Soak in the Passage
 - Read the passage multiple times. Each time, pray and ask God to speak to you—inviting His Spirit to give you insight, clarity, and understanding.
2. Follow the O.I.A. Method:
 - **Observation** – Write down everything you notice in the text, even the simplest details. Don’t overlook the obvious—just note what you see.
 - **Interpretation** – What do those observations mean? Seek to understand the message and context of what you’ve written down.
 - **Application** – Based on what you’ve read and understood, how does this truth apply to your life? What is God calling you to believe, change, or do?
