Exodus Study #6

Exodus 6:1-30

1. Verses 1-9

- a. Why does God remind Moses, “I am the LORD”?
- b. What promises does God make in verses 6-8, and how do they point to Christ (deliverance, redemption, adoption, inheritance)?
- c. Why didn’t Israel listen? How does discouragement sometimes drown out God’s promises in our lives?

2. Verses 10-13

- a. Why does God keep sending Moses despite his feelings of inadequacy?
- b. What does Moses mean by “uncircumcised lips”?
- c. How does God’s call depend on His power, not our ability?

3. Verses 14-27

- a. How does this genealogy confirm Moses and Aaron’s calling?
- b. What does this teach us about God working through families, history, and imperfect people?

4. Verses 28-30

- a. Why does Moses repeat his doubt?
- b. What does God’s persistence reveal about His patience and mission?

How to Study God’s Word Effectively:

Remember the simple yet powerful approach we’ve learned:

1. Soak in the Passage
 - Read the passage multiple times. Each time, pray and ask God to speak to you—inviting His Spirit to give you insight, clarity, and understanding.
2. Follow the O.I.A. Method:
 - **Observation** – Write down everything you notice in the text, even the simplest details. Don’t overlook the obvious—just note what you see.
 - **Interpretation** – What do those observations mean? Seek to understand the message and context of what you’ve written down.
 - **Application** – Based on what you’ve read and understood, how does this truth apply to your life? What is God calling you to believe, change, or do?
