Genesis Study #53

Genesis 48:1-22

1. Verses 1-7

- a. Why do you think Jacob emphasizes God's promise in verses 3–4 as he prepares to bless Joseph's sons?
- b. What is the significance of Jacob adopting Ephraim and Manasseh as his own sons?
- c. Who, in a sense, were disqualified from their positions of leadership in Israel's family because of their sins? (See Genesis 34:25; 35:22)

2. Verses 8-20

- a. Why do you think Jacob crossed his hands and gave the greater blessing to Ephraim?
- b. How does this moment echo other biblical stories of reversed blessings (e.g., Jacob & Esau)?
- c. What does this tell us about how God works through unexpected or non-traditional choices? What are other examples of this in the Bible?

3. Verses 21-22

- a. How does Jacob's faith shine through in his final words to Joseph?
- b. What might the "one portion more than your brothers" symbolize spiritually or historically?
- c. How does Jacob model trusting God in the face of death?

How to Study God's Word Effectively:

Remember the simple yet powerful approach we've learned:

- 1. Soak in the Passage
 - Read the passage multiple times. Each time, pray and ask God to speak to you—inviting His Spirit to give you insight, clarity, and understanding.
- 2. Follow the O.I.A. Method:
 - Observation Write down everything you notice in the text, even the simplest details. Don't overlook the obvious—just note what you see.
 - Interpretation What do those observations mean? Seek to understand the message and context of what you've written down.
 - Application Based on what you've read and understood, how does this truth apply to your life? What is God calling you to believe, change, or do?
