Gospel of Matthew

Matthew 20:1-16

God Moves Unexpectedly

They all worked for the same master. They all worked until dark. The only difference is the time they clocked in was different, but the time they clocked out was the same. No matter how long each one worked, their paycheck was the same: 1 denarius.

This unexpected move angers the early workers, who feel they deserve more. We may sympathetically agree with them. They worked 12 hours, some worked 9 hours, some worked 6 hours, some worked 3 hours and some worked 1 hour.

The angry early workers are confronted with the master's response, (Matt. 20:13-15)

13 But he replied to one of them, 'Friend, I am doing you no wrong. Did you not agree with me for a denarius? 14 Take what belongs to you and go. I choose to give to this last worker as I give to you. 15 Am I not allowed to do what I choose with what belongs to me? Or do you begrudge my generosity? 16So, the last will be first and the first last.

We are not privy of how the workers responded to that. The point we are to take away from this is that God can dispense His grace and mercy as He sees fit and we are not going to be left out.


All should have rejoiced because they were rewarded for their effort.
