Main Idea: Don't Be Taken Captive by deceptive and enslaving false teaching.

Outline: Paul gives us two means to safeguard us from being taken captive:

5.	Compare Ephesians 6:10–20. How does one fight? What does it mean to put on the armor of God? How does a Christian put this on daily?
6.	What role does prayer play in this spiritual battle?
7.	When v.15 says Christ has "disarmed rulers and authorities" who is he talking about? What have these rulers and authorities lost? What are the implications of this for your life?
8.	How does the triumph of Christ give you great hope in the fight?
