OUR CANCELLATION POLICY:

For the safety of all participants, digs are always weather-permitting and cannot be guaranteed. If weather conditions require them to cancel, they will contact us as soon as possible prior to our dig (via phone call or e-mail) to reschedule or refund.

If circumstances require you to cancel your dig, please contact Dave or Candace as soon as possible so that we may try to accommodate other dig guests. Please note: we regret that we will be unable to refund a deposit of \$250.00 if we're unable to schedule another participant in your place.

WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW:

The dig site is an approximate 1/3-mile hike from the parking shelter area with an elevation gain of 125 feet over uneven terrain; they will pace the walk to suit our needs, making stops along the way. Their property is an active dig site in the badlands. Weather can be extreme; summer temperatures can exceed 100 degrees with little or no shade, possible windy conditions, no restrooms (portable unit at the parking-shelter area) or drinkable water. I'd encourage you to consider investing in a good hat and possibly a Camelbak. I found one on sale for \$14.95 Just search "Camelbak pack" on Google shopping. It was at "Stealth Angel". *The bottom line is, please be prepared.*

We will make a great effort to ensure a safe excavation experience, but we need your help to accomplish that. Therefore, a waiver of liability will need to be signed on the day of your dig.

Only paying guests who have signed a waiver of liability will be allowed on the FACT dig site property. Minors must be accompanied by a paying adult (parent, guardian, or approved sponsor).

Bring your camera! We'll stop for photographs along the hike. We'll gladly photograph you with your camera/cell phone as well. You may also wish to photograph your digging experience and discoveries. *Note: they do have cell coverage at the dig site.* Record and upload later!!

WHAT IS INCLUDED IN YOUR DIG FEE:

Use of all necessary excavation tools which will be provided at the dig site.

Admission to the museum. Please allow time in your visit to Glendive to walk through the museum. Guided tours are offered by the museum with advance notice at no additional charge, subject to guide availability. Carl will be available if you'd like to go through with him as well.

Water. It is recommended to have at least 1 bottle of water per person. We'd suggest at least 2 and on hot days, at least 3 bottles per adult. We will have cases of bottled water for you to take when we meet under the Dinosaur, but I still like the Camelbak! The dry climate and elevation can catch you by surprise, especially when digging. Protect yourself. If you want something else to drink, please bring it.

WHAT IS NOT INCLUDED IN YOUR DIG FEE:

Transportation. The dig guides will meet us the morning of our dig in the museum parking lot by the T-Rex head at 8 a.m., where we will follow them to the dig site in our pre-arranged vehicle. Dave will have seats available if you want to carpool and will have the water there for you to pick up. At the end of the dig, they will accompany us back to the museum parking lot (if needed).

Snacks (for half-day digs) and/or Lunches (for all-day digs). Snacks and lunches will be eaten up at the dig site; be prepared to carry everything up with you in a backpack or cooler (please pack out your trash). There are many options for food. Here are just a few:

Plus, there is a Conoco gas station right across from the Dinosaur Museum that has snacks. Ownership of fossils. All fossils found on the dig site property *belong to Carl!* We wish! No, they belong to the museum because they may be of value to ongoing work and study. They understand that taking home fossil souvenirs from our excavation is a special part of the experience; so these will be granted at the discretion of our dig guide. Please keep in mind this is an authentic dig site (bones are not "planted" for discovery); therefore, though they will do their best to help us find fossils, they cannot guarantee our discovery of them.

HOW YOU SHOULD DRESS:

- Hat (a wide-brim hat with an adjustable string to secure in a breeze is ideal)
- Long-sleeved shirt or sunscreen (if you choose sunscreen, remember to bring it for reapplying) • Full-length pants
- Sturdy shoes (athletic shoes are okay, hiking boots are best)
- Fitted work gloves if you have sensitive hands. Floppy or loose gloves can easily damage fossils. • BRING CHAPSTICK! Or some other lip moisturizer. You will need it.

WHAT YOU SHOULD NOT WEAR:

- Contact lenses will be uncomfortable due to wind, dust, and dirt at the site. Wear glasses, if possible. • Sandals, flip-flops, crocs, etc. These are simply dangerous. Wear sturdy, comfortable shoes. • A frown.

Carl, FACT, and Glendive Dinosaur and Fossil Museum all look forward to being with you on this adventure!
