ESTABLISHING COMMUNITY GROUP SHEPHERDS

It's been such a joy to see how our Shepherds have grown in both confidence and compassion this past year, especially as many have not been in this role before. What encourages me most is seeing Shepherds leaning into one another, praying together, and stepping into shepherding not as a role to fill but as a calling to care for Community Group Leaders and group members.

This year we have raised up 31 Shepherds.

As we look ahead, our vision is to continue building a culture where Shepherds are thriving in gospel-centered community themselves so that they can lead others into the same. We want to grow in multiplying healthy groups, developing new leaders, and seeing our groups increasingly marked by prayer, Scripture, and mission. Our hope is that every group becomes a place where people encounter Christ, experience authentic care, and are equipped to live on mission together. Our Shepherds are the foundation to this happening at the Springs!

BEGINNING COMMUNITY GROUP LEADER TRAINING

Community Groups are the heartbeat of how we live out the gospel together. In Acts 2:42-47 we see the early church gathering regularly, devoted to the Word, prayer, fellowship, and the breaking of bread. That wasn't a clever strategy, it was a Spirit-led community that changed the world. Our vision is to see that same kind of biblical community flourish here at the Springs.

Community Group Leaders are the gatekeepers of this vision. Trainings over this past year have been about creating spaces where people can belong, be known, transformed by the gospel, and sent out on mission. These trainings are about equipping leaders in Community Groups into deeper discipleship with Jesus, and authentic community with one another.

Every conversation, every prayer, every shared meal matters.

Our vision for these trainings is simple: that every person in our church is cared for and growing in Christ through community. Over this next year, our focus will be on communication and care. How can we better care for the leaders and members of our Community Groups?

We desire that our Community Groups become places where people can be honest about their struggles, where lives are being transformed, and where the gospel is shaping real people in real living rooms all across our city. That's what we're building together.

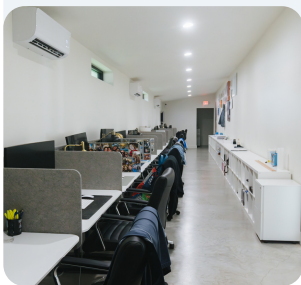
OPENING OF THE SPRINGS ANNEX

MARRIAGE MINISTRY RE | ENGAGE

Over the past year the ministry of re|engage has seen nearly **80 couples** from the Springs and other local churches come together and experience healing and growth in their marriages.

We are currently in our fourth session, and continue to see God move in remarkable ways. Marriages that once seemed hopeless have been brought from death to life and couples are now being equipped to help others on the same journey. One especially moving moment came when a participant in their 70s asked for accountability software to be placed on their phone, showing that transformation and growth in Christ is never limited by age.

Looking ahead, we are excited to see more marriages strengthened, restored, and prepared to pour back into others, multiplying the impact of this ministry for years to come.

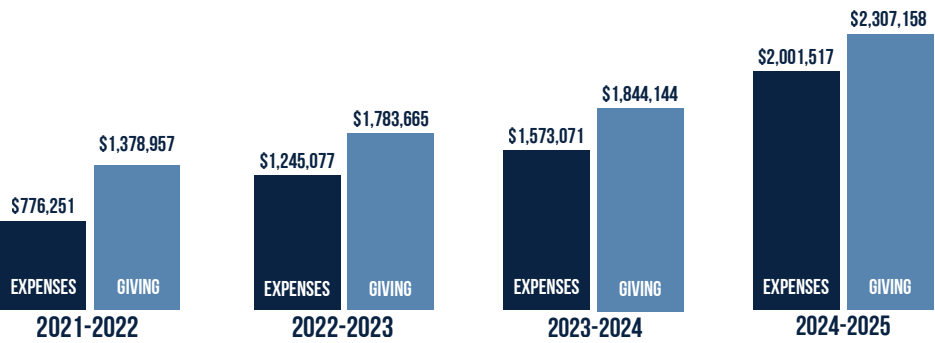

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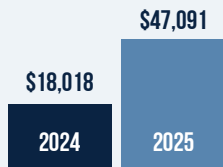

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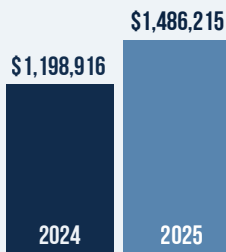
WE CALCULATED OUR PROJECTED OPERATING INCOME FROM GIVING BY AVERAGING THE MONTHLY CONTRIBUTIONS OVER THE PAST YEAR (JULY 2024 TO JUNE 2025). TO ACCOUNT FOR PROJECTED ANNUAL GROWTH, WE THEN APPLIED A 15% INCREASE TO THIS AVERAGE.

432 RELIEF FUND



In addition to operating costs, members can give towards the Springs 432 Relief Fund which seeks to wisely provide for the basic needs (food, clothing, shelter, medical care) of Members during financial hardship.

BUILDING FUND



We have continued to create a building fund where people can give towards a future building opportunity. This reflects \$1 million set aside by the Springs in 2024. The rest is funds that were given during our initial Finding Home campaign in summer 2024 and money given over the past year.

GROWTH ADVISORY TEAM

As seen in the previous pages, the Springs continues to grow, stretching the limits of our spaces. We've adjusted by maximizing the auditorium, expanding Kid's Ministry, and opening the Annex for offices and added meeting rooms. These steps have provided short-term relief while we plan for long-term solutions.

While we celebrate this growth, our Elders remain focused on the spiritual health of our church family. To support them, the Growth Advisory Team was formed to research and recommend space opportunities, always keeping healthy growth at the center. Their work is shaped by research of four key themes:

Healthy Growth

Prioritizing spiritual growth while wisely managing numerical growth.

Financial Readiness

Preparing now so we're ready to act when God provides a property.

Logistical Clarity

Outlining the steps needed to acquire and develop a facility.

Church Communication

Keeping the church family informed and prepared.

After an initial review of the current space and challenges, the team believes that pursuing a permanent facility is the best path forward. The greatest challenge lies in finding a suitable property (either buildable land or existing buildings with remodel potential) in central New Braunfels that fits both our space needs and budget realities.

We ask for your prayers for wisdom as we trust the Lord to guide us, and invite any questions or feedback along the way.

By His Spirit, our heart is to help people love and live for Him, together. Despite imperfections, we pray God uses us to advance His Kingdom in our city, the hill country, and the world. May our reputation be that Jesus changes everything and He is worthy of everything. His Kingdom come!
