# Sometimes it can feel hopeless...but God is at work

We face continual and ongoing challenges engaging college students. Honestly, sometimes it can feel hopeless. Students are noncommittal, quick to shift plans and not come to something if a more attractive option arises, even if that option is sleeping or gaming. Even our most involved students struggle to meet regularly with us. It can be immensely discouraging.

Beyond that, the spiritual climate on campus continues to grow even more resistant to Christianity and apathetic to the gospel. Doing evangelism on campus ushers a whole myriad of responses, from outright rejection, indifference, or apathy. For example, recently when asking a few students "what happens after death?" they responded with "Ehh, I'll figure it out when I get there..." or "I don't care". There is a pervasive posture that life is their own. They determine truth, purpose, love, and life; and that death holds no power or relevancy.

On the outside it could seem as though there is no hope to reach this generation with the hope of Jesus. We must admit there are times the hardness of the soil and the impossible task of reaching a huge population with the gospel hope of Jesus is both daunting and disheartening.

Yet, God is at work. He always is and always will be. We're reminded often of 1 Peter 5:10 – "And the God of all grace, who called you to his eternal glory in Christ, after you have suffered a little while, will himself restore you and make you strong, firm and steadfast. To him be the power forever and ever. Amen." He is simultaneously strengthening us for the work before us and exercising his power and dominion over all things.

We see him actively at work in our friend Yi's life. Jane introduced us to Yi, she comes from an atheist background and has absolutely no context for Jesus. Yi has been faithfully coming to all our events, attending Tobin's weekly bible study, and meeting up one-on-one with Cassandra to hear the Gospel. Although she has not yet accepted

Jesus, it is amazing to witness the Holy Spirit's work to draw her to himself. She's unexplainably curious, drawn to community, intrigued by the person and life of Jesus, and longing for the hope that Jesus alone offers. Yi graduates in just a few weeks, would you pray that God draws her heart to him in salvation!
