Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

For many years, I have watched a video which depicts Jesus' last 18 hours, leading up to his death. With scientific and medical detail, scientists and doctors explain much of what Jesus suffered and endured for our sake. They describe the anguish that he must have gone through to sweat drops of blood. They depict the bitter brutality of the flogging given by the Roman soldiers and the severe agony Jesus must have felt when they placed the crown of thorns upon his head. Most of all, they explain the excruciating pain of the nails being driven through the nerves of Jesus' hands and feet and the slow agonizing death of suffocation he endured on the cross.

For many of us, being so far removed from this kind of brutality, it is easy not to fully value what Jesus endured for us. It is important that we take time and remember how much Jesus suffered for our sins so we can better appreciate the immensity of God's love, forgiveness and grace. Before we rush to the celebration of the Resurrection, let us reflect deeply on the sacrifice that was made for us, whether it be attending a Good Friday Service, walking the Stations of the Cross, reading through the gospel stories of Jesus' arrest, trial, and crucifixion or watching a video depicting Jesus' passion.

Remember what it says in Isaiah 53:5:

But he was pierced for our transgressions; he was crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his wounds we are healed.

As Easter draws near, I pray that the love of God will bring you joy, hope, and peace.


