That peace and reconciliation opens up a future of living in harmony with God, others and self in heaven as well as a present reality of peace that is found through faith in Jesus Christ. Being able to live in that peace is part of the reality and blessing of the resurrection of Jesus Christ and it is part of the ministry and message of the church.

Let us embrace this ministry in our lives and share God's message of Shalom with the world around us.


