

What to Know Before Receiving the Lord's Supper

Our Communion Statement

We believe, teach, and confess that our Lord Jesus Christ is truly present in the Sacrament of the Altar. His body and blood are given in, with, and under the bread and wine for the forgiveness of sins, just as He says: "This is My body... this is My blood" (Matthew 26:26–28).

In faithfulness to God's Word and in care for all who commune, we practice closed communion. All who are baptized, instructed, and confirmed members of this congregation or of a congregation in fellowship with the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod are welcome to receive the Sacrament. In receiving the Lord's Supper, we not only receive Christ's gifts but also confess a shared faith.

Communion is not a general Christian right. It is an invitation to the holy banquet, and our Lord calls us to be prepared, clothed in faith and understanding. Scripture warns, "Whoever eats and drinks without discerning the body eats and drinks judgment on himself" (1 Corinthians 11:29).

Those not communing today may come forward for a blessing by crossing their arms. Before communing, Luther's Small Catechism encourages each Christian to ask:

Do I believe I am a sinner?

Do I believe in Christ and His words in the Sacrament?

Do I intend, with God's help, to turn from sin?

If you have questions, Pastor Keinbaum or one of the Elders would be glad to speak with you.

Preparing for the Divine Service

Before the Service – Speak to God. During the Service – Let God speak to you. After the Service – Speak to one another.

Please enter the sanctuary quietly and prayerfully, allowing others time for reflection. We ask that all electronic devices be silenced before the Service begins.


What the Word Is About This Week

Faith Clings to the Word and Promises of God and Perseveres in Prayer

"Left alone," Jacob wrestled through the night with the Lord, "until the breaking of the day" (Gen. 32:24). Though "Jacob's hip was put out of joint as he wrestled with him" (Gen. 32:25), he would not let go until the Lord blessed him. At times, we, too, strive with God; He strives with us and blesses us by grace. So Jesus teaches us "always to pray and not lose heart" (Luke 18:1). Jesus speaks of "a judge who neither feared God nor respected man" and of a widow "who kept coming to him and saying, 'Give me justice against my adversary" (Luke 18:2–3). Because of her persistence, the judge agreed to "give her justice" (Luke 18:5).

Our Lord dispenses justice generously and swiftly, giving "justice to his elect, who cry to him day and night" (Luke 18:7). He does so according to the Gospel. Therefore, His ministers are to persevere faithfully in their vocation, in what they "have learned and have firmly believed" (2 Tim. 3:14). On the basis of "the sacred writings" (2 Tim. 3:15), they are to "preach the word" at all times and not lose heart (2 Tim. 4:2).


Apostles' Creed

DEVOTION

On What Has Now Been Sown

"On what has now been sown, Thy blessing, Lord, bestow; The pow'r is Thine alone, To make it sprout and grow. Do Thou in grace the harvest raise, And Thou alone shalt have the praise! "O grant that each of us, Now met before Thee here, May meet together thus, When Thou and Thine appear, [...]

"O grant that each of us, Now met before Thee here, May meet together thus, When Thou and Thine appear, And follow Thee to heav'n, our home. E'en so, Amen, Lord Jesus come!

Jesus often used stories of the soil—of seeds and fruit, planting and harvesting—to teach His lessons about the kingdom of God. In His parable of the sower, a farmer scatters seed over a path, on rocks, among thorns and in good soil, where the seed grows and bear fruit. As Jesus explains to His disciples, the seed is the Word of God, and the soil represents those who hear the Word.

Whenever we gather for worship, the seed of the Word is scattered among us as we hear the Scripture lessons and listen to the Word as it is taught in the sermon. The seed may be scattered out of hymns that celebrate the story of our salvation. We hear the words of our Lord in His holy Supper. We are the soil on which the seeds fall.

Our hymn is a prayer, asking God to bless the seed of the Word that was planted in worship, a prayer that He might graciously "make it sprout and grow" and raise a harvest to eternal life. As the apostle Paul explains, different individuals—for example, pastors and teachers—will plant and nurture the seed, but it is "only God who gives the growth" (1 Corinthians 3:7b). In the soil of hearts made receptive by the Holy Spirit, the seed of the Word thrives and bears fruit.

All of this seed-scattering, planting, and growth happens because one single Seed, a grain of wheat, fell to earth and died so that it might bear fruit. This is how Jesus spoke of His death on the cross and His resurrection from the dead as the first-fruits of the harvest of life and resurrection to come (see John 12:23-24; 1 Corinthians 15:23).

As soil made receptive by the power of the Spirit, we have been born again, "not of perishable seed but of imperishable, through the living and abiding Word of God" (1 Peter 1:23b). Rooted deeply in Christ Jesus, we grow and thrive. Joined to our true Vine, we bear the fruit of love and service that brings glory to God.

In our hymn we pray that all who received the seed of the Word in our worship will meet together again at the final harvest, when Jesus returns to gather us to Himself. Until that day we pray that the Lord of the harvest will continue to send His workers—such as pastors, teachers, and missionaries—into the ripening fields. Come, Lord Jesus!

THE PRAYER: Lord of the harvest, bless the teaching and hearing of Your Word. By the power of Your Spirit, cause the seed of the Word to bear in our lives the fruit of love and service. Amen.
