What to Know Before Receiving the Lord's Supper

Our Communion Statement

We believe, teach, and confess that our Lord Jesus Christ is truly present in the Sacrament of the Altar. His body and blood are given in, with, and under the bread and wine for the forgiveness of sins, just as He says: "This is My body... this is My blood" (Matthew 26:26–28).

In faithfulness to God's Word and in care for all who commune, we practice closed communion. All who are baptized, instructed, and confirmed members of this congregation or of a congregation in fellowship with the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod are welcome to receive the Sacrament. In receiving the Lord's Supper, we not only receive Christ's gifts but also confess a shared faith.

Communion is not a general Christian right. It is an invitation to the holy banquet, and our Lord calls us to be prepared, clothed in faith and understanding. Scripture warns, "Whoever eats and drinks without discerning the body eats and drinks judgment on himself" (1 Corinthians 11:29).

Those not communing today may come forward for a blessing by crossing their arms. Before communing, Luther's Small Catechism encourages each Christian to ask:

Do I believe I am a sinner?

Do I believe in Christ and His words in the Sacrament?

Do I intend, with God's help, to turn from sin?

If you have questions, Pastor Keinbaum or one of the Elders would be glad to speak with you.

Preparing for the Divine Service

Reading Summary What the Word Is About This Week

The Word of Christ Is the One Thing Needed

"The LORD appeared to [Abraham] by the oaks of Mamre" (Gen. 18:1) and received his hospitality. But Abraham received the gracious promise of a son. Though Abraham and Sarah were very old, nothing is "too hard for the LORD" (Gen. 18:14). His Word appointed the time and fulfilled the promise. In the same way, the Lord Jesus "entered a village" and received Martha's hospitality (Luke 10:38). "Martha was distracted with much serving" because she was "anxious and troubled about many things" (Luke 10:40–41), but her sister, Mary, "sat at the Lord's feet and listened to his teaching" (Luke 10:39). The service of love is no sin, but "one thing is necessary" for both faith and love — the Word of Christ (Luke 10:42). Thus, the ministers of Christ are sent "to make the word of God fully known, the mystery hidden for ages and generations but now revealed to his saints" (Col. 1:25–26).

The LORD appeared to [Abraham] by the oaks of Mamre, as he sat at the door of his tent in the heat of the day. He lifted up his eyes and looked, and behold, three men were standing in front of him. When he saw them, he ran from the tent door to meet them and bowed himself to the earth and said, "O Lord, if I have found favor in your sight, do not pass by your servant. Let a little water be brought, and wash your feet, and rest yourselves under the tree, while I bring a morsel of bread, that you may refresh yourselves, and after that you may pass on—since you have come to your servant." So they said, "Do as you have said." And Abraham went quickly into the tent to Sarah and said, "Quick! Three seahs of fine flour! Knead it, and make cakes." And Abraham ran to the herd and took a calf, tender and good, and gave it to a young man, who prepared it quickly. Then he took curds and milk and the calf that he had prepared, and set it before them. And he stood by them under the tree while they ate.

Devotion May We Thy Precepts, Lord, Fulfill

"May we Thy precepts, Lord, fulfill And do on earth our Father's will As angels do above; Still walk in Christ, the living way, With all Thy children and obey The law of Christian love.

"Spirit of life, of love and peace, Unite our hearts, our joy increase, Thy gracious help supply. To each of us the blessing give In Christian fellowship to live, In joyful hope to die."

Our hymn speaks of "the law of Christian love." In our culture today, love and law are words that are not often associated. Love may be understood as license, permission to live according to one's desires, even if those desires are contrary to the Law of God. In contrast to that point of view, our hope and desire as Christians is to do the will of our Heavenly Father. We love Him and, with the help of the Holy Spirit, we want to obey His commands.

In Holy Scripture, the commandments, or precepts, of God are summarized according to the word "love." Jesus said that the greatest commandment was to love God with all of one's heart and soul and mind. The next greatest commandment, Jesus said, is to love your neighbor as you love yourself (see Matthew 22:37-40). The apostle Paul summed it up this way: "Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore love is the fulfilling of the Law" (Romans 13:10). On the night before He died, Jesus washed His disciples' feet in an act of love and service. Then the Lord spoke of love and a new law, telling His disciples, "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another" (John 13:34).

The law of Christian love is a law of self-sacrifice, the giving of self in service to others just as Jesus gave Himself for us. According to this law of Christian love we seek to serve others and, in doing so, carry out our Heavenly Father's will "as angels do above." It is a law of love expressed in the fellowship we have with our brothers and sisters in Christ.

Such love in our lives is a reflection of the love and grace of our Heavenly Father, who loved the world and sent His Son to be our Savior. As we follow the law of Christian love, we seek to walk in the way of love that Jesus walked as, obedient to His Father's will, He sacrificed His own life to save us.

The Holy Spirit unites our hearts in Christ Jesus and leads us to live within a fellowship of love. The Spirit gives us the courage to trust in our loving God, to live according to His law of love and finally, secure in His eternal love "in joyful hope to die."

WE PRAY: Lord Jesus, help me to live according to Your law of love. Amen.
