OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD PRAYER TREE

Prayer is the most important part of Operation Christmas Child. Please take a look at the photos decorating the OCC Prayer Tree near the Welcome Desk. The photos show 5 stages of a shoebox's journey: people packing shoeboxes, the shoeboxes moving through Processing Centers to be shipped to over 100 countries, volunteers in receiving countries transporting the shoeboxes to pastors, the shoeboxes being distributed to children, and children attending the 12-week discipleship course, "The Greatest Journey."

In 2024, just under 12 MILLION shoeboxes were delivered with the Good News of Jesus Christ to children worldwide. It is a tremendous endeavor to pack, collect, transport and deliver these shoeboxes and then to teach "The Greatest Journey" to children. Please take a photo from the tree home with you to pray over the part of the shoebox's journey shown in the photo. Those 12 million shoeboxes – and the children who receive them - absolutely need to be covered in prayer.

IGNITE

Ignite, our mentoring and tutoring program for children in care, was launched in 2023 at First Baptist Church of Pensacola to meet one of the most requested needs from foster parents. It's well known that one caring adult can turn a child's story from a statistic into a success story — and Ignite does just that. Through one-on-one mentoring sessions held weekly during the school year, students build meaningful relationships while receiving valuable academic support. We are deeply grateful for the dedicated volunteers who make Ignite a life-changing program for our students and their families.

One of those volunteers is John Heer, who faithfully serves in several ministries within our church. In the testimony that follows, John shares about his experience with Ignite and how God has worked through this ministry in his life.

"Serving as a mentor in our Ignite Mentoring Program has been a huge blessing in my life and based on feedback from the kids and their foster parents has had a positive impact on them too. These children in care have seen and heard things that most of us never will. They've had challenging childhoods and meeting with them weekly gives some stability to an otherwise chaotic life.

Yet, even though they have experienced things most of us cannot even imagine, they want to be loved. That's where we come in.

Being with them weekly provides an opportunity to be present and for God to work through us with them. We help them with their homework, but even more importantly we establish a relationship with them and demonstrate Christ's love for each one of them.

From a practical viewpoint, helping them get better at learning gives them a better chance of success in school and then hopefully becoming a contributing member of society, thus breaking the generational effects of their early years.

From a personal standpoint, we get to experience the Love and Joy Jesus talks about when we do His Will. And this makes me want to serve in other foster areas as well.

Finally, this exposure gives us the opportunity to pray for these kids and their families."

The Ignite Mentoring Program is more than tutoring—it's an opportunity to reflect Christ's heart to children who desperately need to see His love in action. Through simple acts of presence, patience, and prayer, God is changing lives—both theirs and ours. As we continue to show up week after week, we're reminded that the smallest seeds of faithfulness can grow into lasting hope.
