

WHY does FBCP have a Church to Church Food Ministry? Are we just providing sustenance for the food insecure in our city? This message from a C2C partner pastor after our July distribution answers both of these questions.

"I just wanted you to know we had a lady pray to receive Christ today at our food distribution and another couple say they are ready to stop saying they need to get back in church and actually do it. The husband even gave me his cell number and asked me to text him at 9 to encourage him in case they get lazy. That's the Holy Spirit right there! Thank you for your leadership and the service of all the volunteers. Today would not have happened without yall!"

While providing much needed food to the hungry, we are facilitating witnessing opportunities for our partner churches, and our God Is being glorified and souls are being added to the Kingdom.

Saturday, July 19, 1300 families received the makings for approximately 50 meals, including canned/dry goods, fresh produce and meat.

Our next distribution will be **Saturday, September 13.** We will pack food boxes on Friday, August 15, and Saturday, August 16, at Mission First. We will begin at 9:00 a.m., and stop at noon. PLEASE CONSIDER VOLUNTEERING FOR THIS CHRIST HONORING MINISTRY!

2025 DEACON NOMINATION PROCEDURE

The Committee on Placement invites each member of the church to review below the qualifications for deacons as adopted by the church. A member may suggest as many names as one thinks qualified to serve. Please nominate <u>ONLY</u> those that have not served as a deacon at FBCP in the past.

These suggestions must reach the committee by <u>Sunday, August 10, 2025</u> to be considered. Suggestions are to be submitted only by members of the First Baptist Church, and therefore <u>MUST BE SIGNED</u> to be accepted.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR DEACONS

- Must have been a member of FBCP at least 2 years and a minimum of 25 years of age.
- A deacon must live toward the standards set forth in I Timothy 3 and Acts 6.
- Spiritually mature individuals serving as lay leaders of the Church.
- Faithfully participate in worship and Bible study.
- Be involved in mission and/or ministry.
- Demonstrate Biblical stewardship by practicing consistent, regular giving to the Church.
- Demonstrate a lifestyle of self-control.
- · Promote goodwill and harmony.
- Regularly share faith in Christ.

RESPONSIBILITIES FOR DEACONS

- Serve as spiritual catalysts and lead others to participate in mission and ministry by example.
- Help the staff build consensus within the church.
- Encourage, support, and commit to practical ministries that allow our staff to focus on the priorities of equipping the saints for the work of ministry.
- Pray diligently for the spiritual, physical and emotional health of the Church.
- Assist the pastor and Leadership Team in communicating and promoting programs and visions to the congregation.
- As an example of servant leadership, a deacon is expected to be a member of at least one Ministry Team.
- Be available for "Deacon-of-the-week" service, approximately once a quarter.
