It's a simple question to which the church has always given a not so simple answer. Jesus is the one "who is, and who was, and who is to come, the Almighty." (Rev. 1:8)

### A MOMENT OF PASTORAL CARE with Rev. Chris Carson

When I was serving as an Army Chaplain deployed to Iraq in 2007, our command outpost was located in a large empty building. We had no electricity for several months except for generated power reserved for mission essential needs. This meant that when I held chapel services, there were no lights to read the Scripture or sing the songs. I had to borrow a soldier's head lamp so that I could read from the Bible.

Last year thousands of our western North Carolina neighbors experienced darkness from power outages. Many of us know what it's like to be in the dark temporarily, but there's another kind of darkness we can feel during times of loss. A sense of loss that can seem to be magnified during the holidays when we keenly feel the absence of our loved ones.

I remember preaching in the darkness, but thanks to battery supplied light, I could read from Psalm 139:11-12 to encourage the listeners. God knows those times when we may feel "the darkness will hide me and the light become night around me." Those moments or extended periods of darkness can even seem as if they surround us.

But the Psalmist looks to a God who transcends darkness. He confidently declares "even the darkness will not be dark to you: the night will shine like the day, for darkness is as light to you." As we draw closer to celebrating the coming of our Savior, may we look to God who penetrated the darkness with the Light of the world. In the midst of our grief may we lean upon the One to whom "even the darkness will not be dark." To whom the "darkness is as light."

Be sure to walk this journey with someone. Do this with a trusted friend or perhaps a counselor. Our church has people who are trained to come alongside those who are hurting - Stephen's Ministers. Contact Lorene McBryde or Steve Horosko to learn more details.

We are having a service for those grieving during the holidays called "Darkness to Light" Wednesday, 17 Dec in the Fellowship Hall at 5:30. There are other resources for those dealing with grief. The Billy Graham Evangelstic Association offers a free guide entitled "Courage in Grief."

There are also numerous grief support groups in Fayetteville that can be helpful, including GriefShare. Most of all, the church family invites you to join your brothers and sisters in Christ as you navigate the challenging days ahead.



Lost after Vivaldi's death and rediscovered in the 1920s, it has become a beloved Christmas classic.
