### A PASTORAL MESSAGE

from Dr. Mike Garrett

Some books change us. They say something we need to hear just the way we need to hear it. I still have an old yellow paperback on my shelf titled Evangelism: Doing Justice and Preaching Grace, by Harvie Conn.



Harvie was the Professor of Missions at Westminster Theological Seminary. Back in 1983 I was sitting in class when a guy walked in with thick eyeglasses, a noticeable limp, old clothes, and hair that looked like it was combed with a garden rake. I was hooked. He spoke of his years of mission work in South Korea among prostitutes. He told them they were sinners in need of repentance. Nobody listened. Then he made a discovery. Most of the

women had been sold into a system of sex slavery in a male-dominated culture. Their captors made sure there was no way out.

As Harvey tells it in his book, no one changed until he changed:

"I discovered that a person is not only a sinner.

He or she is also sinned against."

My old copy has that quote underlined and starred multiple times. It was the beginning of my pilgrimage to understand biblical justice and a realization that I did not.

Some of us are quick to blame individuals for their wrongdoing and insist on "justice" by which we usually mean punishment. Others of us are quick to blame the "system" for the way individuals turn out and see justice as what it takes to make things right. The bible's definition of justice doesn't allow for such an easy choice.

Now is a good time to study "biblical justice". It's at the center of the story of the Old Testament. It is the heart of Jesus' gospel. The divided voices of our public and political life are quick to insist on the need for justice, and equally quick to say the other side has it wrong. As Christians we need to pay attention to what our faith has to say, first.

I'll be offering the class, "What is Biblical Justice?" on Wednesday evenings beginning on October 29 at 6:30 p.m. We'll be working on understanding this very important teaching in scripture. We will meet in the activity room. Bring a bible and join us for a rich time of learning together.






