



A PASTORAL MESSAGE FROM DR. MIKE GARRETT

In case you've missed the message, things kick into high gear at First Presbyterian Church in September! Programs resume, classes start, and sermon series begin like they do every year. There's nothing magic about turning over a page on the calendar, but we all need that sense of fresh beginning on the spiritual journey that is our life.

This year will include something very different. This summer the session of our church decided our congregation needs a renewed vision of the church God is calling us to be. We went through a process like that about a decade ago which created our current mission statement, new priorities, and the motto we see in so many places, "Serve and Share". Much has happened since then, and much is yet to happen, so the time has come to pray, listen, and dream again about our future.

Very soon you will hear about "Crossing Thresholds," a congregational visioning process that will be guided by our leaders and lead by Pinnacle Leadership Associates. You will be at the heart of this effort. Through congregational surveys, a structured season of prayer, listening groups, and special events we will listen for what God is saying to and through the church.

We'll come to new clarity about the kind of church we are and want to become as we continue this congregation's spiritual journey. These discoveries will guide us in setting priorities and making important decisions in the next few years.

I'm asking that you pray now for the success of this important effort. I'm also asking that when you are asked to participate you seize the opportunity! This process will help you grow spiritually and contribute to the direction and health of our congregation. The impact will be felt for years to come.

Most of us would be quick to say we live busy lives. The first task of discipleship is to put Jesus Christ at the center of our busy life. That requires intentionality, time, and often sacrifice. I hope you will take time this month to identify how and when you will grow as a Christ follower. May God continue to bless you and enable you to be a blessing in the life our congregation.

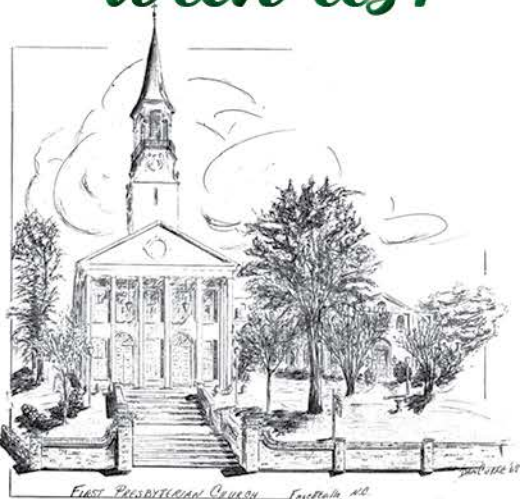

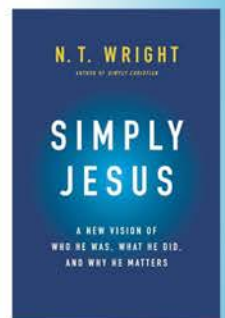
