At our first distribution, we handed out groceries to 93 families, totaling over 400 people. Each family received between \$60-\$200 worth of groceries, depending on their size. Families come from the Anderson District 4 area. To date, we have about 115 active families in the program, but since inception, we have served over 380 different families during this ministry.

The program is often called Release Time. Parents can release their children from school during an elective class to leave campus and receive Christian Education.

Pendleton Methodist Church is a host church for seventh and eighth graders from Riverside Middle School. Teachers Nathan Fox and Jeff Terry instruct, guide, and mentor the youth. This past school year, approximately 200 students attended 40 classes per week at our church. Best of all, there is already a waiting list for classes next school year!

As we wrap up the program for this year, we celebrate powerful spiritual victories and testimonies! Over 65 students dedicated their lives to Christ!

PMC had 25 dedicated volunteers serving in this ministry! The first and foremost way for you to support this ministry is with your prayers! Church Council Update

The Church Council is the governing body of Pendleton Methodist Church, and I am honored to be your Chair. The Church Council is made up of a chair, vice-chair, recording secretary, treasurer, our lay leader, senior pastor, lay members to the annual conference, chairs of all our church committees, and 12 at-large members who serve 3-year terms. Our church staff members are non-voting members of the council. The leadership of our church is chosen by a Nominations Committee chaired by Pastor Kevin Cooley.

Committees include church historian, stewardship, congregational life, finance, PEEPS, communications, SPRC, trustees, children's ministry, youth ministry, young adult ministry, senior adult ministry, and worship.

In February of this year, we had our annual planning retreat. Highlights included creating a long-range planning committee, approving the budget, establishing stewardship goals, regular editions of our church newsletter, hiring an accompanist for the choir, hiring a sound technician, hiring an interim Discipleship Ministries position, renovation of the upstairs, and emphasis on programs for all ages.

We have had two meetings since then, with plans under-

way to put our Long-Range Planning Committee together with Russ Guffee as Chair. Hiring of all positions were discussed at the Planning Retreat except Youth Ministry. Congregational Life Teams are in place. Work on re-creating the Outreach Committee is ongoing. Our finances are in good shape, and we have tithed 10% of our surplus from last year to two new church plants in the GMC in South Carolina and 10% mid-year to educational scholarships for those going into the ministry in the GMC in South Carolina.

Over the years, I have served on the Church Council from time to time, with my last role being Stewardship Chair before being asked to fill the "huge" shoes of Arlene Privette as Chair of the Council. I am excited about the growth in our membership and look forward to having the voice of ALL our members as we embark on our long-range planning.




Our Stewardship

God has been faithful to PMC as we have been faithful to Him! The graph below presents giving toward our operating expenses for years 2022-2025. During 2024, our giving for operations exceeded budgeted operating expenses. During the current year, our giving for operations has also exceeded our budgeted operating expenses to date. Pastor Kevin has challenged the Church Council to tithe on this additional giving, and we have been able to give to the following missions and ministries beyond what is included in our budget from this excess budget giving and accumulated designated gifts:
