

From Compromise to Cleansing - Genesis 34 & 35

- 1. Genesis 34:1–2 Dinah's decision to "go out to see the women of the land" led her into danger. How can we guard our hearts and homes against curiosity that draws us toward compromise?
- 2. Genesis 34:13–29 Simeon and Levi took vengeance into their own hands. Why do you think revenge often feels justified, and what does Romans 12:19 teach us about letting God handle justice?
- 3. Genesis 34:30–31 Jacob rebuked his sons out of fear rather than righteousness. How can fear of consequences cause us to minimize or ignore sin instead of confronting it biblically?
- 4. Genesis 35:1–4 When Jacob called his household to "put away the foreign gods," it required a spiritual house cleaning. What "foreign gods" or compromises might God be calling you to remove from your life today?
- 5. Genesis 35:5–7 As Jacob obeyed, God's protection fell upon the surrounding cities. How have you seen obedience to God bring peace or protection in your own walk?
- 6. James 4:7–10 Cleansing and humility go hand in hand. What practical steps can you take this week to submit to God, resist temptation, and pursue holiness?
- 7. Genesis 35:14–15 Jacob built an altar after his renewal at Bethel. What spiritual markers or disciplines can you establish to remind yourself of God's grace and your renewed commitment to Him?
