Discussion Questions:

- Read Matthew 6:19-24. What does "storing up treasures in heaven" mean to you
 personally? How have you stored up treasure in your own life? In what ways do
 you think societal pressures influence our focus on earthly treasures?
- How do you balance the need to work and provide for yourself and your family with the call to focus on heavenly treasures?
- How do you determine who or what is the "Lord" of your life? What practical steps can you take to ensure that Jesus remains at the center?
- How can being part of a Christian community help you in your journey of transformation and in storing up treasures in heaven?
- Read Matthew 7:1-6. How do you understand the difference between judging others and using discernment? How can we apply this understanding in our daily interactions?
- Why do you think it's easier to notice the faults of others rather than our own?
 What are some ways you can regularly check for "planks" in your own eye?
- How can we extend love and mercy to others while still standing firm in our beliefs and values?
- What are some cultural pressures that challenge your commitment to living out kingdom values? How do you resist these pressures?
- What is one specific change you feel called to make in your life to better align with the teachings of the Sermon on the Mount?

Closing Prayer: Heavenly Father, Help us to be mindful of the teachings of Jesus, especially those from the Sermon on the Mount, and to live as Kingdom people, reflecting Your love and grace in all we do.
