THE CONTEXT

- •Today, over **123 million people** have been forcibly displaced worldwide.
- •1 in every 69 people on Earth has been displaced
- •For most, the possibility of returning home does not exist.



WHY FORCED DISPLACEMENT EXISTS

- Fleeing conflict
- Persecution
- Extreme poverty
- Climate-related hazards

INCREASED IMMIGRATION ENFORCEMENT

1100 people detained since September; 2300 total this year in Chicagoland area

over 60% have no criminal record

1.5 million arrived legally, fleeing situations of humanitarian concern, and since January their status has been revoked
