Baptism: A Step That Changes Everything

Baptism is more than a church tradition—it's a deeply personal and sacred moment that means everything to God. When Jesus Himself was baptized, it wasn't because He needed to repent, but to fulfill all righteousness and set the example for us: But Jesus said, "It should be done, for we must carry out all that God requires" (Matthew 3:15). When we're facing a tough choice at work, dealing with family drama, or trying to heal from past pain, our baptism is a reminder that we're not who we used to be. We've been buried with Christ and raised to walk in a new way: For we died and were buried with Christ by baptism: *And just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glorious power of the Father, now we also may live new lives* (Romans 6:4). Baptism also connects us to a larger spiritual family—others who have made the same commitment and can walk with us as we grow. If you haven't taken this step yet, know that it's not about being perfect—it's about trusting the One Who is.
