FOR THOUGHT & TALK

Take no more than 5 minutes to quickly review the main points from Pastor Jeff's message. As you discuss the questions, don't expect to answer all of them. Just discuss the ones your group would most like to explore together. Remember, the goal of your small group is to grow together relationally, to apply God's Word to our daily living, and to pray for one another and our church.

3. Share where one of the people's stories highlighted in Hebrews 11 especially resonates with you. As a group, talk about how Hebrews could praise people like these who were such obvious failures for God in parts of their lives.

4. Pastor Jeff's emphasis was that no one is past God's being able to "recycle" and use a person for His Kingdom. If so, then how do we know where to draw the line between "Jesus has forgiven them, so we should" and "How can we let a person who has done <u>that</u> into Church leadership again?"

5. Share which of the five closing thoughts are hardest for you. Why is that?
