



Our Story - by Andrew & Nan Barnes

We found The Gathering during the pandemic. Our previous church didn't offer much online and expected people to be in the building, even when that wasn't possible. But, The Gathering was different—it had a robust online presence. For four years, that was our church home from the living room couch, especially while our daughter, Joanna, was still little.

Eventually, we began attending in person and quickly got involved. Both of us grew up in churches where serving and giving were just part of what you did. So, when we found a new church home, we knew we didn't just want to attend—we wanted to participate. Church isn't something we consume. It's something we contribute to.

We joined a CoreGroup, started serving, and committed to giving financially—not out of obligation, but because we believe belonging requires commitment. Now that our daughter is getting older, we're even more aware that she's watching. We want her to see that faith isn't just something we talk about—it's something we live. And we want to model an authentic faith, not a performance. That means showing up, being honest, serving with joy, and giving even when it stretches us.

Giving has been part of both our stories for a long time. Andrew was raised to tithe. And, generosity became a habit early in Nan's faith journey—even when money was tight in college. For us, giving is like investing. We're business school grads—we know that when you invest in something, you become more connected to it. Giving makes The Gathering our church, not just a church.

We give because we believe in what's happening here. Whether it's CoreGroups, community outreach, or meaningful worship and teaching—our gifts are making a difference. And, we want Joanna to grow up in a church where love, justice, and generosity are lived out loud.

Much has been given to us. And with joy—we embrace that much is expected.



For nearly 20 years, The Gathering has grown through pivotal moments of bold vision and increased generosity.

From expanding our sites and staff at key times, to building our new McCausland site, to reconnecting post-pandemic—each step forward has been made possible by your generosity.

The growth has continued as we've built new and vibrant ministries, welcomed an increasing number of new people seeking community, and become a place of refuge and meaning in uncertain times.

We believe God is once again calling us not simply to maintain what we've been given, but to raise expectations with a comprehensive, two-year \$10 million generosity initiative to:



1 STRENGTHEN OUR

FOUNDATION

You have helped to lay the groundwork for The Gathering to create a uniquely welcoming Christian community. Together we have impacted lives in ways we never could have imagined. While we are always excited to explore new opportunities, we also know it is time to reinforce and reinvest in the most critical components of our foundation as a church.

FELLOWSHIP & FACILITIES

In 2019, we hosted about 400 meetings for CoreGroups, recovery ministries and community groups across all sites. That number has now grown to more than 1,400! We want to utilize our spaces in meaningful ways outside of Sundays, which means keeping up with resources and infrastructure. With your help we can continue to be a hub of hope and healing in our local community.

NEW GENERATIONS

225+ kids now attend The Gathering every week. They represent almost 25% of the total population on any given Sunday! 152 Middle and High Schoolers also participate in Student Ministry events each month. We must be relentless in our support of families and kids. They represent the next generation of Christian servant leaders. This will require ongoing investments in caring and talented ministry leaders as well as updates to our technology, classrooms, and curriculum to meet the changing needs of young people.

WORSHIP & MINISTRY

Online and in person attendance is increasing at The Gathering. We have an opportunity to build upon compelling worship and explore opportunities for additional services. Ministries like CoreGroups, Care and Connections fuel spiritual depth and a sense of community. We need to continue to invest in thriving ministries and the talented staff and volunteers who lead them.

2 FUEL OUR

GROWTH

When we see that ministry is succeeding at The Gathering, we want to fuel its growth. Right now there are several areas of ministry that have grown significantly. We want to invest in expanding them.

WELLNESS & DISABILITY MINISTRIES

In 2023, The Gathering launched a Wellness Ministry to help people feel safe to share their struggles, offer practical tools to reduce stress, and replace the stigma around mental health with empathy, shared wisdom, and support. In just two years, Wellness has served nearly 500 people throughout St. Louis. We have the opportunity to support thousands more.

We have also made strides to better welcome people with disabilities and their families into the full life of the church. This includes one-on-one care and other accommodations in Kids Ministry, a bible-study for adults with disabilities, and several special events. **However, there is so much more to do.**

BETTER DIGITAL & ONLINE PRESENCE

More than 12,500 people have downloaded The Gathering app and thousands more are looking for spiritual guidance and a place to belong online. **An investment in our online presence will allow us to reach beyond our physical walls, connect with homebound members, engage with seekers online, and offer spiritual resources 24/7.**

FURTHER INVESTMENT IN LOCAL NEEDS

We want to be a church that actively addresses local challenges and makes a tangible difference in the lives of neighbors. With your help, The Gathering has given thousands of dollars and directed hundreds of volunteers to local nonprofits. We've sprung into action when the Red Cross needed blood, tornado victims needed relief, and our neighbors during the pandemic needed assistance for groceries or medical bills. And yet, we know so much more is expected and possible.



3 ENLARGE OUR

FOOTPRINT

For years, we've prayed for opportunities to deepen our roots and broaden our reach. We've seen lives transformed within our community, and now, it's time to multiply that impact.

NEW CHURCH SITES

We believe God is calling us to launch two new church sites to serve areas hungry for hope, connection, and a place to be curious about Jesus. These sites won't just be buildings; they'll be gathering places for worship, community, and service, tailored to meet the specific needs of their unique contexts. They will be sites of The Gathering, which means all will be welcome, no asterisks.

RESOURCING PASTORS AND CHURCHES

Beyond planting new churches, we will come alongside and empower pastors and churches outside the St. Louis area. **Think** of the impact we can have by supporting dedicated leaders who are often ministering with limited resources or feeling isolated. Through the BEYOND Conference, which now has been hosted in St. Louis and North Carolina, we've interacted with hundreds of pastors who feel this disconnect. We have an opportunity to invest in the larger body of Christ, strengthening the Church as a whole, and seeing the ripple effect of healthy, thriving ministries across the region and beyond.

RECOVERY MINISTRY

There is a growing need for worship and community spaces for people in recovery from addiction. We are already deeply invested in a recovery center in Illinois and our spaces are home to hundreds of community recovery meetings each year. We're ready to create an even more robust Recovery Ministry, including worship services tailored for those on this journey.

TWO YEARS, \$10 MILLION

As we approach the 20th year of ministry at The Gathering, we feel a strong call from God to offer the hope of Christ in a radically welcoming way to more people in St. Louis and beyond. We want to strengthen our roots, invest in ministries that are working, and plant new churches for the first time in 10 years. In order to accomplish this bold vision it will take gifts totalling \$10 million over the next two years.



COMMUNITY PARTNER SPOTLIGHT

Kimberly Wilson Principal, Pierre Laclede Elementary School



The Gathering began our work with Pierre Laclede Elementary School in St. Louis Public Schools as part of The Literacy Project in 2018. Over the years our program has evolved with their changing needs and that flexibility, along with the personal connections and trust built over time, are what Principal Kimberly Wilson believes really set our partnership apart:

"One of the things that's important is having community partners that value our goals the same way we do. Some partnerships just provide resources, which is always helpful. But, one of the unique things about The Literacy Partnership is that you all provide human capital, which is very special. And, as needs have changed over the years, The Gathering has asked me for my feedback, which is awesome. With a lot of community partnerships, It might be, 'Hey, this is what we're offering, do you want it or not?' It's something special when someone comes in and says, 'What do you need? What do you see this program looking like? How would it benefit your school, your teachers, your students?' That's powerful.

There's also a community connection as you provide students with books that they can take home through the My Own Library program. You've even started working directly with our preschool families giving them tools and facilitating workshops to help them get their children ready for Kindergarten. So this partnership doesn't just impact the school, it also impacts the home as well.

Another important aspect of our partnership is your help appreciating my staff. That's a hard thing for principals sometimes. We don't get a budget to appreciate our teachers. And so we have to be very strategic. It's nice to have a partner who can do that for me.

I've been in a couple of schools that have had partnerships with different organizations, and I've never experienced one quite like this. I've never seen where someone is providing that constant inspiration for students, families, and staff. I really do think this partnership is special."



We believe God has entrusted To Gathering with the responsibility to significantly impact peoples' lives and reach new generations for years to come. To meet these expectations, each of us must allow God to challenge us to step out of our comfort zone into the future. A future we believe is full of possibility and hope.

FAQs

WHAT SHOULD I INCLUDE IN MY COMMITMENT?

As you consider your financial commitment over the next two years, you will want to factor in the following: (1) what you typically give on a weekly basis, (2) your faithful increase over what you typically give, (3) any special offerings you plan to give, such as Easter and Christmas Eve, and (4) any stored resources. There are three different commitment examples on page 32 to help you with yours!

WHAT ARE "STORED RESOURCES"?

Stored resources are the funds or assets you have other than income. For example, you may have savings, stocks, bonds, or other investments that you decide to give to the church. You may have been holding onto a car, boat, a vacation home, or other property. What would it look like to let go of some of the "stuff" to reinvest in the lives of others?

WHAT IF I AM CURRENTLY EXPERIENCING FINANCIAL STRESS OR HARDSHIP?

If you are currently struggling with unemployment, or if you are carrying the heavy burden of substantial debt, we are here for you. This fall, The Gathering will offer Saving Grace, a multi-week class that helps you develop a plan for taking control of your finances. If you are in need of care, we have trained care ministers and pastors who can meet with you to discuss your current situation. As you work to overcome financial barriers to giving, consider that giving isn't about what God wants from you; rather it's about what God wants for you.

I GIVE TO OTHER CHARITIES. WHY SHOULD I DIRECT MY GIVING TO THE CHURCH?

As followers of Jesus, God calls us to give first to the Church for the work of the body of Christ. At The Gathering, we know firsthand that the church changes people -- we regularly hear those stories of transformation. Giving directly to specific causes can help people in need; however, those causes were started by people whose lives were transformed. When you give to The Gathering, you are investing in a new generation of people who will transform our world.

WHAT IF I AM NEW AROUND HERE?

We hope you'll find the vision for The Gathering something you want to be a part of.
