#### WHERE WE'VE BEEN

Founded in 1855, Florence Baptist Church began with a small group of eleven dedicated believers. Over the years, we've faced challenges, celebrated milestones, and remained steadfast in our mission to multiply gospel impact.

From organizing our first Sunday school in 1880, to moving to our current property in 2009, to launching a second campus in 2016, our journey reflects God's faithfulness and our commitment to His Great Commission.

#### WHERE WE ARE

God is moving at Florence Baptist-our worship attendance has grown from 795 in 2021 to over 1,400 in 2025.

We're excited about the growth, but there are thousands more to reach with the gospel. Our classrooms are at capacity, families are searching for preschool and childcare options, and people in our community are struggling with loneliness and disconnection. We need to maximize our property and resources to welcome, disciple, and connect with more people in our community.

### WHERE WE'RE GOING

As Florence Baptist steps into the future, we have an opportunity to expand our impact for the next generation, to foster deeper community, and to serve our city in greater ways.

We are stepping into a season of growth - creating spaces where people can find hope, families can belong, and the next generation can Experience Jesus.

Our church has always been about reaching **The One**. This is our defining moment to step forward together in faith.

# **EXPERIENCE JESUS**

#### **INVESTING IN STUDENTS**

A dedicated student worship venue will provide a space for the next generation to Experience Jesus.

This space will be designed with middle and high school students in mind, giving them a place to worship, learn, and connect with peers and leaders who will point them to Christ. As cultural pressures increase, students need a clear and compelling alternative to what the world offers, and this venue will help anchor their identity in Jesus.

# CREATING SPACE FOR THE NEXT GENERATION

Expanding and renovating Kids & Kids Jr. spaces to welcome more families.

We're outgrowing our current children's environments, and we know that reaching families often starts with reaching their kids. These expanded spaces will be secure, engaging, and built to help children hear the gospel, build relationships, and begin a lifelong journey of following Jesus.

# EXPANDING OUR REACH AT THE CHURCH AT HEBRON

Additional parking spots in the field adjacent to the building.

Each Sunday, we are reaching the limits of our current parking capacity at The Church at Hebron. First-time guests pull into the lot and struggle to find a parking spot, leading them to turn around and leave our campus. Expanding our parking will remove this barrier and ensure we're not limiting future growth and gospel impact.

Building gathering areas, including a welcoming indoor play space, a multi-use atrium, and an outdoor playground facility at The Church at Hebron.

We believe connection leads to transformation. These environments will create space for casual conversations, group gatherings, and everyday moments that turn strangers into friends and friends into family. Whether it's a parent connecting over coffee while their kids play or a small group meeting midweek, these spaces help our church become more than a place you attend - they help it become home. The outdoor playground at Hebron will also serve our programming needs while providing space for families to easily gather, play, and connect.

We have an opportunity to meet a critical need in our community by offering quality weekday childcare.

Our community has a growing shortage of trusted, faith-based childcare and preschool options. Indoor and outdoor recreation spaces, expanded facilities, and a new home for Hope Ministries will create new opportunities for outreach and engagement.

Whether it's hosting sports leagues, opening our doors for community events, or creating space for people to gather in meaningful ways, these new environments will help Florence Baptist be known as a church that exists not just for itself, but for the good of the city. 

# THE GIVING JOURNEY

We believe generosity is one of the clearest signs of a life being transformed by Jesus. The Giving Ladder isn't about pressure - it's about spiritual growth. It's a tool to help us evaluate whether money is something we manage for God, or something that manages us.

This journey isn't about reaching a destination. It's about taking your next step of obedience, sacrifice, and faith. Scripture invites us to grow in every area of our walk with Christ - including the grace of giving:

"But since you excel in everything—in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in complete earnestness and in the love we have kindled in you—see that you also excel in this grace of giving."

2 Corinthians 8:7

# 1. INITIAL GIVER

2 Corinthians 8:7-15

An Initial Giver takes the first step. Maybe you've never given before, or never given intentionally-but now, something is stirring. This is the moment where you choose to trust God and give, even if it's just a small beginning. It's not about the amount-it's about the obedience.

# 2. EMERGING GIVER

2 Corinthians 9:6-8

An Emerging Giver starts to give **consistently**. You've seen God's faithfulness, and you're beginning to build trust. Whether it's setting up a recurring gift or just making it a regular practice, you're becoming more intentional and more rooted in the rhythm of generosity.

# 3. INTENTIONAL GIVER

Luke 14:28-35

An Intentional Giver starts asking deeper questions: "Does my giving reflect what I truly value?" You begin looking at your budget through a spiritual lens—aligning generosity with purpose. Many people in this stage find clarity through **percentage-based giving** that helps them prioritize God's mission.

# 4. OPEN-HANDED GIVER

Colossians 1:15-18, 22-23

An Open-Handed Giver sees everything as God's. Money is no longer a source of fear or control—it's an instrument for worship. Your question shifts from, "What should I give?" to "God, what would You have me do with all of it?" It's a posture of surrender that touches every area of your life.

# 5. LIFETIME GIVER

1 Timothy 6:6-19

A Lifetime Giver is thinking beyond the month or the year. You're asking long-term questions: "How can I structure my entire life to be more generous?" From the home you buy to the way you invest, your decisions are shaped by a desire to make a **Kingdom impact** that lasts far beyond you. You've moved from giving as a habit to generosity as a lifestyle.

# NEXT STEPS

# **PRAY**

"What man among you, who has a hundred sheep and loses one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the open field and go after the lost one until he finds it?"

Luke 15:4

This is the heart of Jesus: to pursue the one who is lost, no matter the cost. That same heart shapes our prayers for this initiative. Prayer is where faith begins, not in our emotions or willpower, but in quiet moments of surrender before a faithful God. As you seek Him, ask what role He's inviting you to play in For The One. Bring your heart, your resources, and your future before Him, and trust that He will lead you. We pray that this is more than a financial decision, it's an opportunity to be part of something bigger than ourselves.

# REFLECT

We believe the Holy Spirit will speak as you pray. Take time to listen. What is God asking you to do? Where is He prompting your heart to trust Him more?

If you're married, lean into this process together. Listen, share, and be open to where God is leading you as a couple. And if you find yourselves in different places, don't rush the process. Keep seeking, keep talking, and keep trusting. God often works in unity through honest humility.

# **TAKE A STEP**

Discipleship always includes stewardship. As followers of Jesus, we're invited to hold nothing back - because He gave everything for us.

Taking a step of generosity isn't about equal gifts; it's about equal sacrifice. Whether it's your first step or your next step, ask Jesus to grow your faith as you give. Trust that He will provide. We're not just building buildings - we are building an eternal legacy. And the step you take today will help reach someone's "one" tomorrow.

We know that those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. Let's take that step together.



The For The One initiative is a two-year journey. During this time, every gift given will go toward a unified One Fund. This will fuel our mission to help people **Experience Jesus, Grow Together, and Make a Difference** as well as help us expand our current capacity.

# **AUGUST 10 - ONE NAME**

Big Idea: When we truly see the One true God, we respond by offering Him our one and only life.

Key Passage: Acts 4:1-21 (focus on Acts 4:12)

1 While they were speaking to the people, the priests, the captain of the temple police, and the Sadducees confronted them, 2 because they were annoyed that they were teaching the people and proclaiming in Jesus the resurrection of the dead. 3 So they seized them and took them into custody until the next day since it was already evening.

4 But many of those who heard the message believed, and the number of the men came to about five thousand.

5 The next day, their rulers, elders, and scribes assembled in Jerusalem 6 with Annas the high priest, Caiaphas, John, Alexander, and all the members of the high-priestly family. 7 After they had Peter and John stand before them, they began to question them: "By what power or in what name have you done this?"

8 Then Peter was filled with the Holy Spirit and said to them, "Rulers of the people and elders: 9 If we are being examined today about a good deed done to a disabled man, by what means he was healed, 10 let it be known to all of you and to all the people of Israel, that by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified and whom God raised from the dead-by him this man is standing here before you healthy. 11 This Jesus is the stone rejected by you builders, which has become the cornerstone.

12 There is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to people by which we must be saved." 13 When they observed the boldness of Peter and John and realized that they were uneducated and untrained men, they were amazed and recognized that they had been with Jesus. 14 And since they saw the man who had been healed standing with them, they had nothing to say in opposition. 15 After they ordered them to leave the Sanhedrin, they conferred among themselves, 16 saying, "What should we do with these men? For an obvious sign has been done through them, clear to everyone living in Jerusalem, and we cannot deny it.

17 But so that this does not spread any further among the people, let's threaten them against speaking to anyone in this name again." 18 So they called for them and ordered them not to speak or teach at all in the name of Jesus. 19 Peter and John answered them, "Whether it's right in the sight of God for us to listen to you rather than to God, you decide; 20 for we are unable to stop speaking about what we have seen and heard." 21 After threatening them further, they released them. They found no way to punish them because the people were all giving glory to God over what had been done.

### Summary:

Peter and John boldly proclaim the name of Jesus as the only way to salvation. When we realize there is no other name under heaven by which we can be saved, it changes everything. What is the one thing that drives everything else in my life? Does the way I live my life demonstrate God's place in my life?

# **AUGUST 17 - ONE CHURCH**

Big Idea: We are one church, made up of many members, united for one mission to make Jesus known..

Key Passage: Ephesians 3:14-4:18

14 For this reason I kneel before the Father 15 from whom every family in heaven and on earth is named. 16 I pray that he may grant you, according to the riches of his glory, to be strengthened with power in your inner being through his Spirit, 17 and that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. I pray that you, being rooted and firmly established in love, 18 may be able to comprehend with all the saints what is the length and width, height and depth of God's love,

#### Summary:

The church isn't a building, it's God's plan to bring people together and declare the mystery of the gospel. Every believer plays a part in the mission. In what ways am I using my individual resources (time, talent, and treasure) to build up the body of Christ here at Florence Baptist Church, in my community and/or around the world? What's holding me back from taking one more step of faith and obedience?


# **AUGUST 24 - ONE MORE**

Big Idea: God's heart is for the lost. We are called to pursue one more person with urgency, generosity, and joy.

Key Passage: Luke 15:1-32

1 All the tax collectors and sinners were approaching to listen to him. 2 And the Pharisees and scribes were complaining, "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them." 3 So he told them this parable: 4 "What man among you, who has a hundred sheep and loses one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the open field and go after the lost one until he finds it? 5 When he has found it, he joyfully puts it on his shoulders, 6 and coming home, he calls his friends and neighbors together, saying to them, 'Rejoice with me, because I have found my lost sheep!' 7 I tell you, in the same way, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who don't need repentance. 8 "Or what woman who has ten silver coins, if she loses one coin, does not light a lamp, sweep the house, and search carefully until she finds it? 9 When she finds it, she calls her friends and neighbors together, saying, 'Rejoice with me, because I have found the silver coin I lost!' 10 I tell you, in the same way, there is joy in the presence of God's angels over one sinner who repents." 11 He also said, "A man had two sons. 12 The younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me the share of the estate I have coming to me.' So he distributed the assets to them. 13 Not many days later, the younger son gathered together all he had and traveled to a distant country, where he squandered his estate in foolish living. 14 After he had spent everything, a severe famine struck that country, and he had nothing. 15 Then he went to work for one of the citizens of that country, who sent him into his fields to feed pigs. 16 He longed to eat his fill from the pods that the pigs were eating, but no one would give him anything. 17 When he came to his senses, he said, 'How many of my father's hired workers have more than enough food, and here I am dying of hunger! 18 I'll get up, go to my father, and say to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and in your sight. 19 I'm no longer worthy to be called your son. Make me like one of your hired workers." 20 So he got up and went to his father. But while the son was still a long way off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion. He ran, threw his arms around his neck, and kissed him. 21 The son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and in your sight. I'm no longer worthy to be called your son.' 22 "But the father told his servants, 'Quick! Bring out the best robe and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. 23 Then bring the fattened calf and slaughter it, and let's celebrate with a feast, 24 because this son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found!' So they began to celebrate. 25 "Now his older son was in the field; as he came near the house, he heard music and dancing. 26 So he summoned one of the servants, questioning what these things meant. 27 'Your brother is here,' he told him, 'and your father has slaughtered the fattened calf because he has him back safe and sound.' 28 "Then he became angry and didn't want to go in. So his father came out and pleaded with him. 29 But he replied to his father, 'Look, I have been slaving many years for you, and I have never disobeyed your orders, yet you never gave me a goat so that I could celebrate with my friends. 30 But when this son of yours came, who has devoured your assets with prostitutes, you slaughtered the fattened calf for him.'

### Summary:

Jesus tells three stories to show the heart of God-the lost sheep, the lost coin, and the lost son. Each story shows a relentless pursuit and a joyful return. There is joy in heaven over one sinner who repents. Who is my One? How am intentionally "going after" them so that they may know and experience God's love for them? Am I fully leveraging all that God has so generously given me to contribute to the body of Christ as we reach one more for His glory? If not, why?

## **AUGUST 31 - ONE GENERATION TO THE NEXT**

Big Idea: Faith must be passed on intentionally. We are responsible for helping the next generation know and follow Jesus.

Key Passages: Matthew 18:1-6, Joshua 24, Judges 2:6-10

1 At that time the disciples came to Jesus and asked, "So who is greatest in the kingdom of heaven?" 2 He called a small child and had him stand among them. 3 "Truly I tell you," he said, "unless you turn and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. 4 Therefore, whoever humbles himself like this child-this one is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven. 5 And whoever welcomes one child like this in my name welcomes me. 6 "But whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to fall away-it would be better for him if a heavy millstone were hung around his neck and he were drowned in the depths of the sea. **Matthew 18:1-6** 

6 Previously, when Joshua had sent the people away, the Israelites had gone to take possession of the land, each to his own inheritance. 7 The people worshiped the Lord throughout Joshua's lifetime and during the lifetimes of the elders who outlived Joshua. They had seen all the Lord's great works he had done for Israel. 8 Joshua son of Nun, the servant of the Lord, died at the age of 110. 9 They buried him in the territory of his inheritance, in Timnath-heres, in the hill country of Ephraim, north of Mount Gaash. 10 That whole generation was also gathered to their ancestors. After them another generation rose up who did not know the Lord or the works he had done for Israel. Judges 2:6-10

1 Joshua assembled all the tribes of Israel at Shechem and summoned Israel's elders, leaders, judges, and officers, and they presented themselves before God. **Joshua 24:1** 

14 "Therefore, fear the Lord and worship him in sincerity and truth. Get rid of the gods your ancestors worshiped beyond the Euphrates River and in Egypt, and worship the Lord. 15 But if it doesn't please you to worship the Lord, choose for yourselves today: Which will you worship—the gods your ancestors worshiped beyond the Euphrates River or the gods of the Amorites in whose land you are living? As for me and my family, we will worship the Lord." 16 The people replied, "We will certainly not abandon the Lord to worship other gods! Joshua 24:14-16

#### Summary:

Scripture calls us to teach the next generation about God's faithfulness. This week focuses on investing in kids and students, not just with words, but with our lives, our resources, and our presence. Who has God placed in my life to raise up as part of the next generation? (children, nieces/nephews, grandchildren, friends, students, community, orphans, foster-care, etc.) Am I willing to do whatever it takes to help reach one more generation? What does "passing the faith" to the next generation look like in my life?

# **SEPTEMBER 7 - ONE TRUE GOD**

Big Idea: We give our best to God because He first gave His best to us in Christ.

Key Passages: 1 John 4:19, Romans 5:8, Matthew 6:33, Proverbs 3:9-10, Matthew 6:21

19 We love because he first loved us. 1 John 4:19

8 But God proves his own love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

Romans 5:8

33 But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be provided for you.

Matthew 6:33

9 Honor the Lord with your possessions and with the first produce of your entire harvest; 10 then your barns will be completely filled, and your vats will overflow with new wine.

Proverbs 3:9-10

21 For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

Matthew 6:21

## Summary:

God is a giver. He acted first, loved first, and gave first, and now invites us to respond in kind. This message calls us to honor God with the first and best of what we have, trusting Him with our finances and lives. Our generosity reflects our worship, and what we give to first reveals who we trust most. Is God the one thing in my life that drives all other things? How does the way I use my time, talent, and treasure reflect God's place in my life? Am I offering God leftovers or generously giving Him all that is His to begin with?



#### Will we be adding permanent buildings as a part of this initiative?

Yes. The plan includes a gym with two courts, a student worship center, and additional space for kids. We hope to begin the pre-construction process on the gym and student worship center in the fall of 2025.

#### Have other options and elements been considered?

Yes. Our Executive Team, Senior Staff, Deacon Body, and others have been praying and meeting about this for the past two years. We are confident that this is what God is leading us to do to further our mission and reach our ones.

#### When does our giving to For The One begin?

Beginning on Sunday, September 21, 2025, all giving will go toward funding our church budget needs and the development of our For The One initiative. We are asking people to give toward this vision over a 24-month period.

#### How much will each element cost to complete?

In summary, we estimate that funding for our combined ministries, missions, operations, capital needs, and property expansion over the next 24 months will require \$16 million, with approximately \$8 million designated to capital needs for the initial phase of construction.

#### Will any debt be incurred as a result of this effort?

Our goal is to avoid long-term debt. As commitments are fulfilled and funds are received, we will immediately put those dollars to work - money comes in, money goes out - to keep construction moving without taking on unnecessary debt. In the event that some short-term financing is needed to bridge timing gaps, we have strategies in place to phase construction and use financial reserves to minimize what's borrowed. We're committed to stewarding every gift wisely and staying financially responsible throughout this process.

#### Are there additional ways besides cash that I can give toward For The One?
