Meet in the church parking lot at **10:30am**, if you wish to carpool. Parking may be an issue at the Farmer's Market.

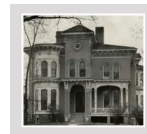


Enjoy lunch at **11am** on your own at Steady Eddie's or in the concourse from vendors.
